GREAT BEND (AP) — The Kansas' official symbols.

Detrich believes naming a state fossil would improve the state's image an image he said was tarnished a year ago, when the state Board of Education voted to de-emphasize evolution on standardized tests given to Kansas public schoolchildren.

Now, Detrich wants the board to endorse the Xiphactinus proposal before it goes before the Kansas Legislature in January.

"That would really send a message that Kansas has finally got things squared away," Detrich said.

Moreover, Detrich said that the Xfish could be used to tout Kansas as a wild game state and call attention to its early history.

"It would also show the need to protect the environment," he said. "We can't do without water and air, or we'll end up like the X-fish."


