

Coach sees improvements in runners

The Goodland Cross Country team had a tough meet at Wamego on Saturday, but the coach said he was pleased by his runners' improvements in their times.

Coach Don Smith said there were 22 Class 4A teams in Goodland's race and that it may be the largest race the team will see. Both teams came in 18th. "The competition was terrific," Coach Smith said. "We were in awe." Smith said he can't think of another sporting event that has 22 teams participating at one time. "Every ranked team in 4-A was at this meet," he said, adding that you have two choices in a competition like this. "You go and get your feet wet or you just say these people are too good and

stay home," he said. "We chose to go." He said most of the Goodland runners ran faster times than at the Goodland meet, some as much as two minutes faster, so he was pleased. "Our goal is to simply get better every meet," he said.

Smith took six boys and six girls to the Wamego meet, mostly freshmen and sophomores.

The Cowboys varsity team consisted of Matt Gattshall, Shawn Weber, Timothy Kafka, Alan Cebula, Lance Tedford and Speedy Aguilar.

In the boys 3.1 mile race, Gattshall had a time of 19:17 for 48th place, Weber had 20:42 for 97th, Kafka had 20:44 for 99th, Cebula 22:03 for 124th, Tedford 22:07 for 126th and Aguilar 22:26 for 131st.

The individual champion in the boys race was Joe Moore of Clay Center

with 16:14. The Goodland varsity girls included Deanna Livengood, Wendy Keith, Rebecca Gattshall, Tiffany Schwasinger, Haylee Mannis and Chelsey Phillips.

Livengood ran the two-mile race in 15:42 for 86th place; Keith ran it in 16:27 for 101st; Gattshall had a time of 16:28 for 102nd place; Schwasinger ran a time of 17:16 for 121st place; Mannis ran it in 18:02 for 125th, and Phillips had 18:44 for 127th.

In the girls race, the winner was Lisa Morrisey of Ottawa who ran the distance in 12:16.

"The only way we get better is to participate against those teams that are good," Smith said. "It was not hot, but the humidity was a big factor in the race. It was very humid."

The team went down Friday and ran

an afternoon practice on country roads outside of Manhattan, where they spent the night. Then they got up at 4 a.m. to get ready and ate breakfast at 5:15 a.m., before they left for Wamego, said Smith.

"I knew it would be difficult before we ever left," he said. "With the young people we have this year, I think when we compare their times in 2000 with 2001, we will see a very nice improvement."

Padres take Rockies

SAN DIEGO (AP)—Woody Williams pitched a six-hitter and John Mabry's two-run single keyed a five-run first inning, leading the San Diego Padres to a 7-2 win Monday night over the Colorado Rockies.

Colorado's Todd Helton went 0-for-4, dropping his average to .379. It hadn't been that low since Aug. 9, when it was .378.

Williams (10-5) retired 16 consecutive batters before Todd Hol-

landsworth homered with one out in the eighth. Williams struck out four and walked none in his third complete game of the season. He also had a run-scoring grounder in the third, giving him nine RBIs.

Mabry's single was one of five hits against Julian Tavarez (10-3), who allowed five runs, walked two and hit a batter as he recorded just one out in the first inning. It was the shortest of his 21 career starts.

POWER POINTS OFFICIAL RULES

- Object of the game is to assess as many of the 136 possible points as you can. Simply review the weeks schedule of games, listed on entry form, and decide which game you are SUREST of picking a winner in. Write the name of your projected winner on the 16-point line. If that team wins its game that week, you win 16 points. Write the name of your second-surest winner on the 15-point line, and so on down to the 1-point line, which game you figure to be a loss-up. Next, fill in Tiebreaker 1, the total points scored by both teams in the week's designated game. If this step fails to produce a winner, the judges will apply Tiebreaker 2, total offensive yardage from scrimmage in this game. If a winner still doesn't emerge, a drawing will be held among those contestants still tied. Decisions of the judges are final. The weekly Missouri - Kansas winner of the contest will receive \$1,000.
