

Mustangs win big

After losing the first two games of the season, Goodland's eighth-grade team had a tremendous win Thursday, stomping the Atwood Buffaloes on their home turf 28-0.

"Our offensive line did an outstanding job of controlling the line of scrimmage," said Coach Greg Craig. "This opened up our passing game which in turn helped our running game."

The coach said the team's defensive line was able to stop the Buffaloes from scoring a single point.

"The defense did a great job," he said.

Statistics from the game show the Mustangs also did well offensively.

David Livengood and Brock Lohr both ran in touchdowns, with Lohr gaining 58 yards for his team over six carries and Livengood gaining 40 yards over 5 carries.

Quarterback Derrick Raymer threw in two touchdowns and two 2-point conversions, with Wade Taylor catching both touchdown passes and one conversion.

Dexter Deeds caught the other conversion.

Raymer made 10 passes, but only six were caught, for a total of 173 yards of pass plays. A.J. Schields had one of his four passes completed, for a 45-yard

pass play.

Schields also caught a pass to complete a 32-yard pass play; Richard Bauman had one catch for a 22-yard pass play; Deeds caught one for three yards; and Drew Wilkens one for 45 yards.

Raymer gained six yards over 3 carries; Deeds six yards over three carries; Lane Winter 27 over six; Daniel Blake eight over four; Darren Howard 41 over seven; Mario Tafoya 10 over two; Brett Jarmin nine over two; and three in one.

The Mustangs recovered four fumbles and blocked one of the Buffalo's punts, while keeping on top of their tackling game to stop the Buffaloes from scoring.

Bauman led the team with 6 tackles; Saint was next with 5; Ruddell and Livengood had 4 each; Anthony Benavides, Schields, Cowan, Perez, Winter and Deeds, 3 each; Taylor, Jake Johnson, Jarmin, Blake, Mannis, James Nelson and Howard, 2 each; and Wilkens, Tray Klinge, Chad Normandin, Tharon Barber, Lorenzo Gomez, Matt Pianalto and Tafoya, 1 each.

The eighth-grade Mustangs will travel to Burlington today to take on the Cougars at 4 p.m.
