

Bulldogs chew up Wildcats 45-0

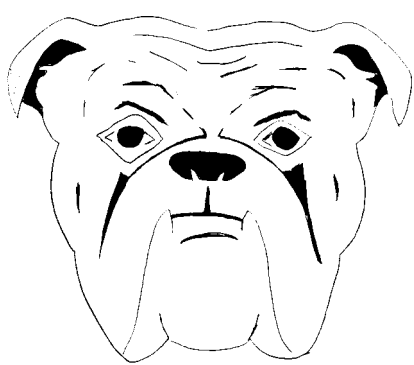
The Brewster Bulldogs chewed up the Sharon Springs Wildcats in a 45-0 rout Friday, leaving the state-ranked Dawgs 3-0 for the year.

Once again the Bulldog's defense denied the visitors' offense access to the scoreboard. The Dawgs recorded six sacks, an interception and 3 fumble recoveries. Jay Reid had 12 tackles and a sack; J.R. Baird had 9 tackles, a sack and a fumble recovery; Justin Jamison 8 tackles, a sack and a fumble recovery; and Nick Juenemann had 6 tackles and 2 sacks to lead Brewster defensively.

Reid and Arnberger hooked up for the first touchdown of the game to give Brewster the 6-0 lead, but the extra point attempt failed. Reid then ran for

a 30-yard touchdown and kicked the extra point, passed to Horinek for a 12-yard touchdown, and ran for 20 yards to the end zone with an unsuccessful extra point attempt to give Brewster the 25-0 lead at the end of the first quarter.

The junior varsity saw lots of playing time in the second quarter, mixing in with the varsity players. Horinek scored on a 9-yard pass from Reid, followed by a 31-yard run to score his



third touchdown of the night. On the extra point attempt, Garner picked up a low snap and threw a shovel pass to Reid for a 2-point conversion.

Sophomore Jacob Falcon made a big tackle on the Sharon Springs offense when they broke through Brewster's defense in what looked to be a touchdown.

Falcon was able to run the Wildcat player down and make the stop.

Brewster's defense held strong. On the offensive side, Jay Reid ran for 111-yards on 8 carries, scoring 3 rushing touchdowns, with Clint Horinek carrying 6/77 with an interception that he ran back for 27 yards. Reid went 3/12 in passing with three reception scoring touchdowns, while Brett Arnberger had one catch for an 18-yard touchdown.

Garner kicked off for the Dawgs seven times with a 40-yard average. Reid punted 3/115 yards in the game. Horinek and Arnberger each had one punt return for 24 yards and 15 yards respectively.

The Bulldogs will host Healy-Utica this Friday night with game time at 7:30 p.m.



Pitcher has great comeback

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — After missing the first half of the season, Blake Stein is making up for lost time.

The Kansas City Royals right-hander called his performance in Tuesday night's 5-1 win over Anaheim one of his strongest ever.

"That's the best command I've had of all three pitches in my entire career," he said.

"I was throwing fastballs for strikes, breaking balls for strikes and change-ups for strikes — and pretty much doing it in whatever count I wanted to," he said.

Stein (7-4) was sidelined from April through June by a broken right forearm. He's 6-1 in his last 10 starts.

Stein gave up three hits and struck out a season-high eight in eight innings. He walked three batters in the first three innings but only one more after that, and lowered his ERA from 5.24 to 4.89.

Mike Sweeney extended a team record with his 136th RBI and closed within two of the 200-hit plateau. Sweeney, Joe Randa and Carlos Beltran hit RBI singles in a three-run third inning for Kansas City, which avoided dropping to a season-worst 13 games under .500.

Sweeney scored his 100th run on Randa's single. Beltran added an RBI single in the eighth off reliever Lou Pote for a 5-1 lead.

Jorge Fabregas made it 4-1 in the seventh when he singled and scored on a wild pitch by starter Ramon Ortiz.

"We scrapped and scraped," Royals manager Tony Muser. "We didn't do it dramatically, but we got some big hits in key situations."

Ortiz (6-6) gave up seven hits and four runs in seven innings. He struck out five and walked three.

Stein didn't give up a hit until Garrett Anderson homered with one out in the fourth to cut Kansas City's lead to 3-1.

"That was actually a good pitch, an inside fastball," said Fabregas, the Royals catcher. "Anderson just did a good job of turning on it."

The only other hits against Stein came in the fifth, when Benji Gil's line drive ticked off the glove of leaping second baseman Carlos Febles, and in the seventh, when left fielder Mark Quinn just missed a sliding catch on a from pinch-hitter Orlando Palmeiro.

"We didn't hit the ball real well, but I think you have to tip your hat to Stein," Angels manager Mike Scioscia said.
