Best man was Mitch Cummings of Wallace, Neb.

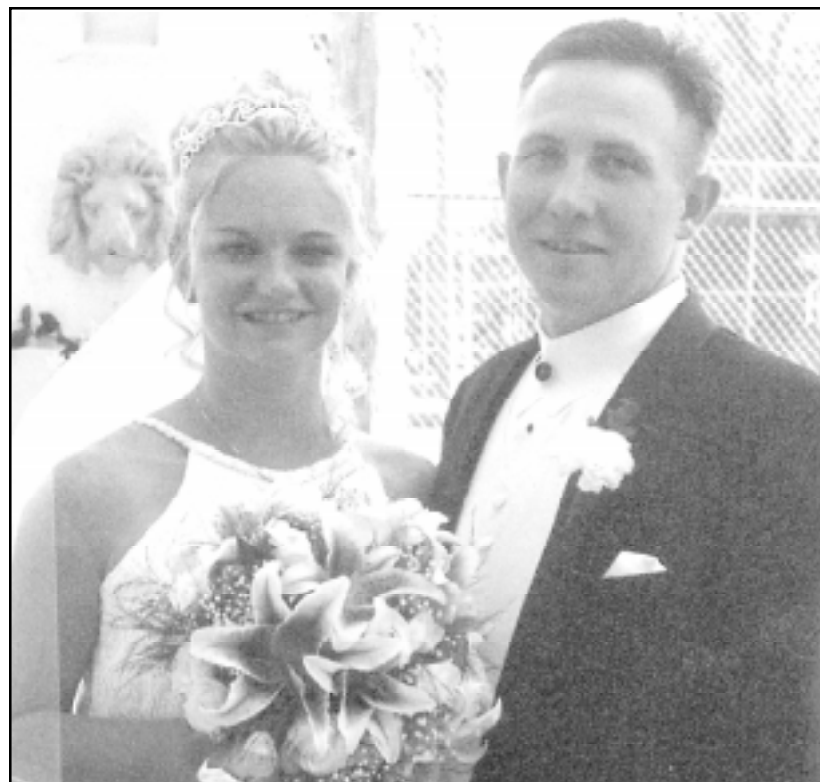
The flower girl was Chloe Miller, niece of the bride, and the ring bearer was A.J. Miller, nephew of the bride.
