## Young man has big catch

Bryce Bahe had a big catch over the Labor Day weekend when he and his family went fishing at Webster Lake.

Bahe, 16, hooked a 12-pound wiper at the lake, which is north of Hays, near Stockton. The fish was 27 inches long with a girth of 21 inches and qualified Bahe as a Master Angler.

He said he has caught wipers before, which are a cross between a white bass and a striped bass, but nothing that big. It was exciting to catch a fish that size,

"They're fun to catch," Bahe said. "I thought I was snagged when it first hit my line.'

He caught the fish using a clown lightning shad lure. Bahe said the lure has a yellow face, orange eyes and red down its back.

To qualify for the certificate, the fish had to weigh over six pounds. Later, Bahe caught a second wiper that weighed 10 pounds and measured 26

He told his family he was going to catch another big fish. He said that since he has been a seventh grader, every two years he has caught two big fish on Labor Day weekend.

In '96, he caught two catfish at Trenton, Neb. Then in 1998, he caught two northern oike, one of which was Master Angler size, in the Red Willow Reservoir in Nebraska.

No one else in the family caught any big fish that weekend, Bahe said, just little fish that they couldn't keep.

He said his dad, Randy, really likes to fish and has taken him fishing for about 12 years.

Bahe participated in the catch and release program, where fish over 25 inches in length are put back in the water after being caught. The first fish he caught at Webster, died after he put it back, but the second one he was able to successfully release.
