# Cards poised to advance

ST. LOUIS (AP) — One more victory, and the St. Louis Cardinals will pay off a 4-year-old debt.

In 1996, the Cardinals were one game away from the World Series before the Atlanta Braves overcame a 3-1 deficit by outscoring them 32-1 in the next three games. After whipping another Braves ace in a 10-4 Game 2 victory Thursday, the Cardinals are poised to advance again.

"I think we're showing right now that we can play good baseball and beat teams that think they're going to beat us," said Jim Edmonds, who tied a division series record with three doubles and had two RBIs. "Hopefully, we can get it done."

The Cardinals have only three players left from the 1996 team. But manager Tony La Russa won't let them forget what happened.

"We recognize this is a three-win series, not a two-win series," La Russa said. "Nobody is celebrating."

They have some reason to celebrate considering the way they treated Greg Maddux and Tom Glavine.

Maddux lasted only four innings in a 7-5 loss on Tuesday and Glavine suffered through his shortest outing in 255 appearances, giving up seven runs in 2 1-3 innings.

# Wildcats favored over Jayhawks

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) — Kansas State has won seven in a row over Kansas, outscoring the Jayhawks in the last three games by a combined score of 152-31.

So what words of encouragement has Kansas coach Terry Allen for his underdog troops as they prepare for another annual clash with their state rival?

"It's as good a K-State team as I've seen," he said.

Odds-makers seemed to think the No. 4 Wildcats (5-0, 1-0 Big 12) would have little trouble victimizing the Jayhawks (2-2, 0-1) an eighth straight time, making them 23-point favorites in Saturday's 1 p.m. renewal of a colorful rivalry that goes back 97 years.

The Wildcats would seem to have everything going their way, starting with momentum. They're coming off a convincing 44-21 whipping of Colorado while Kansas got beat last Saturday at No. 10 Oklahoma 34-16.

Kansas State's Jonathan Beasley is playing about as well as any quarter-

back in the nation. He hit 15 of 25 passes for 293 yards and three touchdowns at Colorado and is now 16-1 as a starter. His NCAA passing rating is a whopping 186.6, tops among all Division I-A passers.

On the season, Beasley has thrown nine TD passes and run for eight more.

"I'm playing pretty good right now. I still have room for improvement," he said. "I'm still making some mistakes when I pitch the ball. I'm making better reads and the offensive line is holding up well for me."

Kansas' Dylon Smith, also a run-pass threat, has been having a rough time. At Oklahoma, he overthrew several wide-open wide receivers and took part in seven ruinous turnovers, including five interceptions.

"That's in the past now," said Smith. "We're just getting ready for K-state."

"Dylon had the rough go last weekend. It can be attributed to a number of things," said Allen. "But he's a competitor. That's the thing I like the most about him. he's practiced very well."

Even Smith is a Beasley admirer.

"He's playing really well. I've seen him make a lot of good plays out there," he said. "He can run people over. He's exciting to watch."

Underscoring the intensity of the rivalry, which often divides families with conflicting loyalty and pits old high school teammates against one another are the Holloman brothers. Ervin Holloman is a starter on the defensive line for Kansas while his older brother Cliff starts for Kansas on its defensive line.

"Our family can't decide which jersey to wear or who to cheer for," said Ervin. "They'll probably cheer for both teams and the crowd will think they're crazy."

Without the turnovers, the Jayhawks might have given Oklahoma a fight.

"They've held Oklahoma to 16 points midway through the game so you know they're going to play hard," Beasley said. "Their defensive backs have had a year to gel together. They'll be ready."

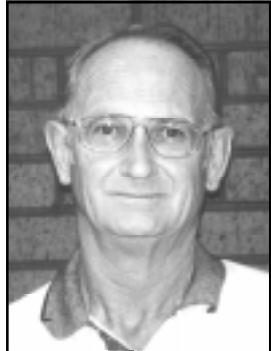

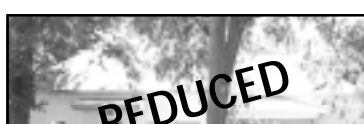
