

Girls golf team takes fifth

One player takes fifth and heads to state

The Goodland Cowgirls took fifth at the regional golf tournament in Wakeeey this weekend, with one member placing fifth out of 56 golfers and qualifying for state.

"I think that we did great for the first year," said Coach Ben Williams, adding that he was happy with how the season had gone.

He said that the pressure might have gotten to the team on Monday.

"We could have gotten fourth," he said, "but now the pressure of the first

season is over and we can go on to bigger and better things."

Freshman Cowgirl Jessica Osborn, with a total score of 93, placed fifth and will travel to the state tournament in Phillipsburg next weekend.

Other Cowgirl golfers included Kayla Rasure, with a score of 114; StevieLee Raymer with 123; Kendra Billinger, 108; Cristina

Beeson, 116; and Audrey Diehl at 139.

The team took in 431 total points to finish in fifth place out of the 10 teams.

Russell scored 374, Trego County

422, Syracuse 433, Ulysses took first with a score of 366, Thomas More Prep second with 390, Colby 467, Hoisington 495, Lakin 392, Holcomb 334 with only three golfers, and LaCrosse 151 with only one golfer.

Ulysses, Thomas More Prep and Lakin will all head to state next weekend for team play.

Williams said that he thinks the Cowgirls did really well going up against teams that were established.

He said he was proud of how they had stood up against Ulysses, which has had a girls golf team for the past 10 years.

World Series hopes rest on one player

ST. LOUIS (AP) — The St. Louis Cardinals' World Series aspirations largely fall on the shoulders of Darryl Kile, who could get three starts in the NLCS.

Kile, who rebounded from eight victories in Colorado last year to his first 20-win season this year, will go in Game 1 of the best-of-seven series against the New York Mets. Manager Tony La Russa said he could also go in Games 4 and 7, each time on three days' rest.

Kile, who won Game 2 of the Cardi-

nals' surprising opening sweep of the Atlanta Braves in the division series, said Monday he's not interested in looking ahead.

"All I know is I've been given a job to do on Wednesday and I'm going to try to do it the best I can," Kile said. "When Tony says it's time for me to go out there and do my job again, I'll try to be ready to go."

Kile threw 232 2-3 innings, the second-highest total of his career, although he's not accustomed to going on three days' rest. The only time he got

fewer than four days between starts was June 27, when he pitched against the Reds only three days after going only two innings in a delayed game.

"It's not about how the arm feels or how it doesn't feel," Kile said. "It's about getting ready to go when he says it's my turn. That's just the way I look at things."

Kile won seven of his last eight decisions, got victory No. 20 in his final start and allowed two runs in seven innings in the playoffs against the Braves.

Tennis team plays in regionals

The Goodland Cowgirl tennis season is winding down as the team went to Pratt Monday to compete in regional competition.

Abby Scheopner competed in singles play for Goodland, while Goodland's doubles teams were Jennifer Mentzer and Jessica Vignery and Ashley Engel and Michelle Kibel.

State competition will be held Friday and Saturday at Topeka Hayden High School.

In recent matches, the Goodland girls placed seventh out of eight teams at a varsity meet held Sept. 26 at Colby.

In singles action, the No. 1 and No. 2 players came away with a record



of 1-3.

For doubles competition, Goodland's No. 1 and No. 2 teams also finished with a 1-3 record.

At the Colby junior varsity meet on Sept. 30, the Cowgirls finished fourth out of seven teams with 12 points.

Goodland's doubles team of Amber Ridder and Cortney Palmer had

a record of 1-4.

Jennifer Mentzer, the No. 1 singles player for Goodland, came in second with a 3-1 record and the No. 2 singles player, Michelle Schierburg, went 0-4.

On Oct. 3, the Goodland girls varsity team traveled to Larned, where they finished fourth.

Coach Wallace Hansen said Jennifer Mentzer and Jessica Vignery played well in the No. 2 doubles spot.

Senior Anna Hare wrapped up her high school tennis career by taking on three good No. 1 singles players, said Hansen.

"Two of her matches were close," he said.

Nebraska and Oklahoma on Big 12 list

DALLAS (AP) — Nebraska quarterback Eric Crouch, Oklahoma line-backer Rocky Calmus and defensive back J.T. Thatcher, all of who were honored earlier this year, are the Big 12 Conference's players of the week.

Crouch earned his second offensive honor for gaining a career-high 302 yards of total offensive in the Cornhuskers' 49-27 victory over Iowa State. Crouch gained 138 yards and a touchdown on 19 carries and completed 7 of 17 passes for 164 yards and a touchdown. All seven of Crouch's completions were for first downs. Crouch also earned offensive honors Sept. 25.

Calmus earned defensive honors for the second time this year, in part for his 41-yard interception return during Oklahoma's 63-14 victory over Texas. Calmus also had four solo tackles, two pass deflections and a sack as Oklahoma held Texas to its fewest yards rushing (minus 7) ever in a regular-season game.


Thatcher received his second consecutive weekly honor and his third of the season. He had three punt returns for 65 yards, including one of 53 yards, to earn special teams honors.
