Garden cleanup prevents over wintering problems

For the last we've heard a lot of speculation about problems of over



problems we've experienced are probably a result of over wintering, and some are not. The best way to prevent over wintering problems is to clean up all garden areas as soon as production is finished. With the early freeze this year, many crops in the garden have already been killed.

Chop and shred the crop residue with a lawnmower and till the area to incorporate the organic residue into the soil. This will destroy most common insects and curb disease problems that may carry over in debris or residue in the garden.

Remove stakes, cages and other plant supports, pulling off any adher- cast you should be able to do a good



ports before next year.

If you want to store them inside, treat them with a bleach-water solution of 10 parts water to one part household bleach. Soak the surface and allow it to dry before moving to an inside storage location.

If you choose to compost crop residue, be sure to do it properly. Composting generates heat to disinfect any disease or insect pests in the process. If you end up with a pile of crop debris, spread the residue on the soil and incorporate as soon as possible.

Literally thousands of drugs are available for purchase "over-thecounter." This means that a prescription is not needed to purchase them. Just without a doctor's prescription does not

mean they are harmless. One of the most important things you should do before purchasing or taking over-the-countermedicines is to read the label carefully. This is especially impor-

tant if you have a special health problem or are on a special diet. One of the most important reasons for

reading the label before purchasing is to be able to answer "yes" to the question, "Is this medicine safe for me?"

Consider the following critical information found on the label to help you decide.

Indications for Use: Is the drug meant to be used the way you plan to use it?

Ingredients: Is there anything in the product you should avoid? Are you allergic to any of the ingredients? Are you sensitive to any ingredients because of a chronic health problem? If you are on a low-salt diet, what is the sodium content? If you are on a low-sugar diet, what is the sugar content?

Warnings: Who should take the medicine?What are the limits on use?Are you currently taking a medicine that it should
