

Goodland falls hard to Colby 27-8

It wasn't just a loss. It was the end to an 11-year winning streak and the last brick in a thick wall standing between the Goodland Cowboys and post-season play.

Before the Cowboys traveled to Colby on Friday to face their district competitor and biggest rival, Coach Chris Walters said the outcome of the game rested on each team's desire. "It's a big rivalry," he said, "because it comes down to what team wants it more."

It's been 11 years since Goodland lost a game to Colby, but this year the Eagles apparently wanted it more. With Mickey Steiner scoring the Cowboys' lone touchdown in the fourth quarter, Goodland fell hard and fast to Colby, ending the game with a 27-8 defeat.

"I think that we got out coached and out played," said Walters.

The loss sealed Goodland's playoff fate, and boosted Colby's chances for post-season play.

"Our playoff chances are done," said Coach Walters, adding that when the season is finished, the coaching staff will go to work building players' muscles and the team's offensive and defensive game.

Going into their second district game of the season, the Cowboys still had playoffs in their sights, though the team had lost 27-20 to the Ulysses Tigers the week before.

Coach Walters said if the Cowboys could muster a substantial win, they would be in a good position to face the Scott City Beavers this Thursday.

The Cowboys will still square off against Scott City at home, but a vic-

tory could only help Ulysses or Colby advance.

After weekend games, Scott City has taken the driver's seat, shutting out Ulysses 28-0.

The score was the same when the Beavers faced the Eagles in their first district game, and if Scott City can do similar damage in Goodland, the team will be on its way to the playoffs undefeated in the district.

Ulysses and Colby, which have both lost to Scott City, are still in the running.

"If we can win at Ulysses, we'll be

2-1 in the district," said Eagles Coach Mike Gottsch. "It gets pretty complicated after that, but we're just going to try to win and see what happens."

Gottsch said the Eagles and the Cowboys both need to have tremendous wins if Colby is going to advance, and the story is the same for Ulysses.

Looking back, Coach Walters said he felt the Cowboys should have done better for the time and energy they put into practice. The team had a 3-3 season record before heading into district play.

"I thought we should have won more

games," he said. "I saw improvement as the year went on."

Next year, he said, the Cowboys will have a different team as talented seniors such as Steiner, Bryce Abbey, Luke Stone, Jeremy Stefan, Tyler Billinger, Kyle Whisler, Tyler Henderson, David Briney, Shandon Wolak, Derek Nichols, Curtis Swager, Matt Mentzer and Danny Rasure graduate.

"We definitely have to run a different style of offense," Coach Walters said. "We just don't have the skill position of players we had this year."

Bengals get first season win against Broncos

CINCINNATI(AP)—Corey Dillon darted into the NFL record book and delivered the Cincinnati Bengals from their futility.

Dillon ran for 278 yards, the most in league history, and broke off touchdown runs of 65 and 41 yards in the fourth quarter as the Bengals beat the

Denver Broncos 31-21 Sunday for their first win.

With their quarterbacks completing only two passes for 34 yards, the Bengals (1-6) ground out a team-record 408 yards and a victory against a defense that prides itself on smothering runners.

Dillon repeatedly cut back and found big holes. He had six runs of 30 yards or more against a defense giving up an average of only 65 per game.

After he outran the weary Broncos (4-4) down the left sideline on a clinching 41-yard touchdown run with 1:49 to play, he jogged to the sideline un-

aware he had just broken Walter Payton's single-game mark of 275 yards against Minnesota on Nov. 20, 1977.

Dillon dropped to his knees, his facemask leaning on the ground, after the record was announced. Teammates dumped containers of water on his
