Kansans to pay online taxes

TOPEKA (AP)—Kansans may have to pay more for items they buy off the Internet because of new computer software that allows the sales tax to be collected.

Currently, most consumers do not pay sales tax for their online buys.

Kansas is one of four states in a National Governors Association experiment to try to get sales tax revenue that state officials say is lost on Internet sales.

"Quite simply, state governments are going to have to come to grips with the fact that the sales tax base is being eroded by Internet sales," Kansas Revenue Secretary Karla Pierce said.

The revenue department estimates that

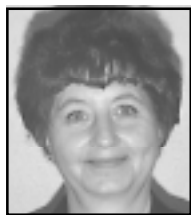
Kansas loses \$2 million to \$5 million annually because of uncollected taxes. State officials say the loss in sales taxes could total \$50 million a year by 2004.

The experiment, which includes Michigan, North Carolina and Wisconsin, is also part of a national effort by state governments to make the system of sales tax more uniform.

The new software would be given to Internet retailers who ask the state for it. The software calculates the tax due and charges consumers' credit cards when they make an online purchase. The retailer turns the tax over to the vendor, who would remit it to the proper state.

All foods can be part of a healthy diet, but filling up on any one food and that includes sugary foods doesn't leave room for a variety of foods that contribute to health and wellness.

Too much sugar is sometimes blamed for hyperactivity in children. There is, however, no evidence that sugar causes children to be more active.

Hyperactivity may be due in part to the activities at birthday parties and holidays at which children gather, not the dessert that is served. Sugar actually has been shown to have a calming effect.

Look at Halloween as a challenge and try a few tricks of your own to get some good food into your little ghosts and goblins.

First, maintain your schedule for regular meals, including a good supper before children go trick-or-treating.

At Halloween parties, include healthy snack choices such as popcorn, pretzels, fruit juice, fruit or vegetable chunks with dip and cocoa made with lowfat milk. These healthy choices will help balance out the candy.

It's perfectly acceptable to hand out non-candy treats on Halloween night.

Pens, stickers, small toys, sugarless gum, individual packages of pretzels or raisins, and hot chocolate packets make great treats.

Set a policy on eating trick-or-treat candy. It's better to eat it moderately over several days as a substitute for dessert or a few pieces along with a healthful snack.

Recipes with a Halloween theme will also help. It could be something as simple as a Jack-O-Lantern sandwich, which is nothing more than a slice of cheddar cheese on top of a piece of whole-wheat bread and topped with another slice of bread from which you have cut out a face.

Save the seeds when you clean out your pumpkin. Rinse the seeds well. Mix three tablespoons of canola oil, 1/4 teaspoon of garlic salt and a dash of Worcestershire sauce and then toss that with the seeds. Spread the seeds out on a cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees until the seeds are brown and crispy.

Make a witches brew by combining a gallon of cranberry juice, a gallon of apple juice and 121 ounces of orange juice concentrate and you're ready for a fun Halloween.
