

Brewster blows game open in second half

Dawgs win, play Saturday

SHARON SPRINGS — In the bi-district round of football playoffs, Weskan (5-5) hung around for a half, but Brewster (9-1) blew open the game in the second half. The game ended on the 45-point mercy rule with 53.6 seconds left in the third quarter. Final score was 64-14.

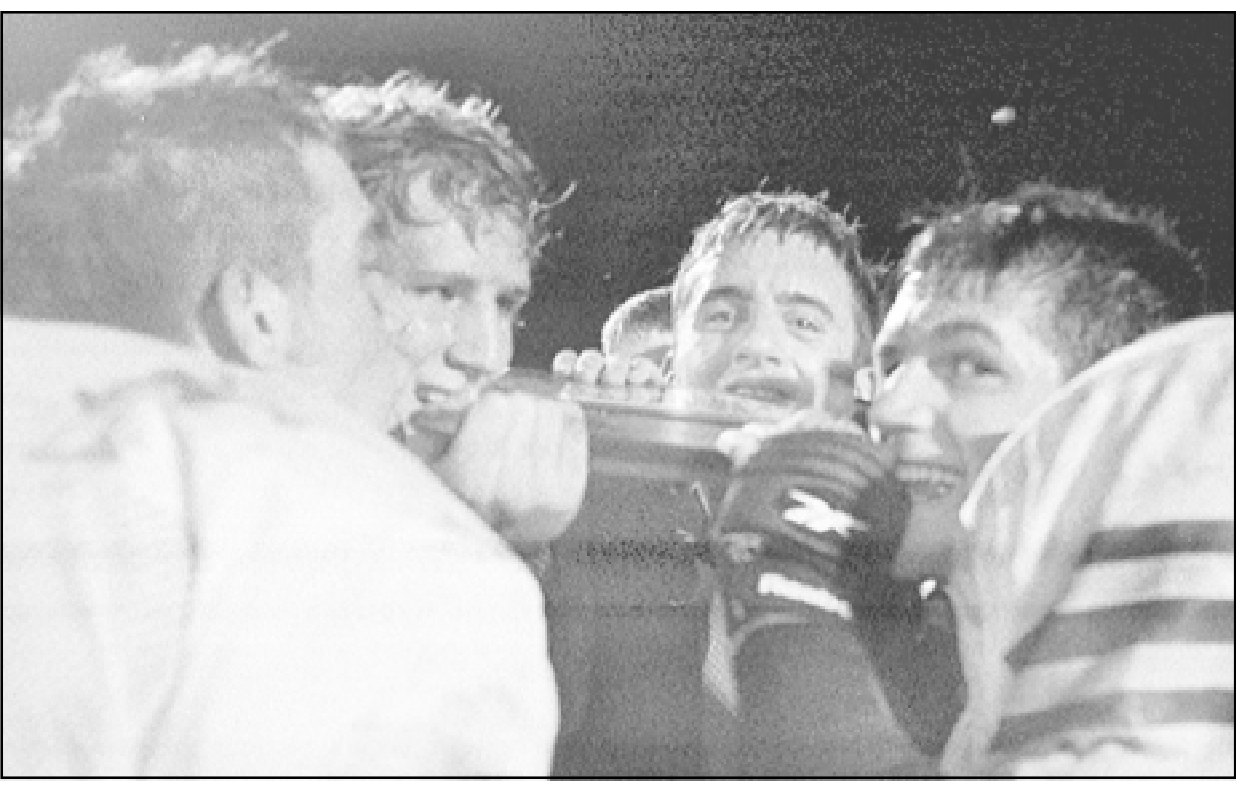
Weskan drove to Brewster's 22 on their first possession before Coyote Laran Steele fumbled. Brewster's Nick Juenemann recovered.

Five plays later, Brewster's Clint Horinek was in the end zone on a 55-yard run. Jay Reid went back to Horinek on a pass for the two-point conversion.

Weskan then put together another good drive that ended in a fumble. At the Bulldog 15, Landon Steele passed to his brother Laran. Laran got hit and fumbled. The ball went straight into the air and Landon ran under it and scored. But Clayton Cox's two-point conversion run was stopped short of the end zone leaving the score 8-6.

Brewster didn't take long to score on their next drive. Reid was in the end zone five plays after kickoff. Weskan almost dropped him at the 25, but they had Reid in a headlock, instead of grabbing his legs. Reid kept moving his legs and the would-be Weskan tacklers dropped away. Weskan's Tyson Brown hurried Reid on the point-after try and his pass to Brett Arnberger fell incomplete.

Brewster forced Weskan to punt early in the second quarter. The Dawgs tried to block the punt, but were called for roughing the kicker instead. The penalty gave Weskan new life. Landon Steele passed mostly to Cox on the drive, including a seven-yard touchdown pass. Steele rolled out, then found Cox alone in the end zone for the score. Steele then ran in the two-point conversion to tie the game. "They shouldn't have had those 14 points," Brewster coach Larry O'Connor said. O'Connor had spent the weekend devising a new defense to run against Weskan but it wasn't working. "I should let my defensive coach (Dick Martaglio) do defense," he said. So the

Dawgs ditched O'Connor's defense. Weskan didn't score any more.

But the Coyotes still had some life. Two plays into the Dawgs next drive, Reid tried to find Horinek. Instead, Weskan's Drew Loftin picked off the pass. Weskan went for a bomb three straight times. All were incomplete, and the third was batted down by Bulldog Jacob Falcon.

In Brewster's ensuing drive, they kept the ball almost exclusively on the ground, with Reid and Horinek taking turns running. Horinek scored from a yard out. Reid found Arnberger for the points after.

Weskan had to punt again.

Then Brewster started to wear out Weskan. Horinek's first run went for 15 yards. Weskan's defense finally stiffened as Josh Lamm and Tucker Sexson dropped Reid for a seven-yard loss. Reid then found Arnberger on a crossing pattern. He made a beautiful one-hand grab that gained 13 yards. Reid broke into the clear on the next play, going for 26 yards. Landon Steele and Cox were the only players who stood between Reid and pay dirt. They made the stop, but the Dawgs were in the end zone two plays later. Reid went to Horinek twice on the same route. The

first pass was low and Horinek dropped it, but the second was successful for a nine-yard score. Arnberger tacked on the points after.

Landon Steele passed twice to Troy Okeson for 23 yards, including a circus catch where Okeson took the ball out of Arnberger's hands. Then Steele tried a pass to Cox that went long. This time Arnberger got the pick at the Dawg 15.

Brewster couldn't score on the gift and time ran out on Weskan in the half with Brewster leading 30-14.

The third was all Brewster.

Horinek scored from four yards out on the second half's opening drive. He spun away from several Coyotes, then dove over the goal line. Reid's conversion pass to Horinek was good.

Weskan had to punt again, then it was Arnberger's touchdown turn. He spun away from Okeson after his catch for a 23-yard score. Reid's conversion pass to Arnberger wasn't successful, though.

Horinek made the next two scores, on 22- and 15-yard runs. Arnberger's pass from Reid on the first conversion try was unsuccessful, but Horinek's pass from Reid on the second one was successful. With this touchdown

Brewster led 58-14.

If Brewster could score again, the ball game would be over.

Reid would not be denied. After a short punt, the Dawgs were at the Weskan 10, but a clipping penalty put them back to the 18. Reid broke three tackles to go into the end zone for the game-ending touchdown.

"Every time we did something big, we'd have a penalty or a turnover," Weskan coach Lance Steele said. "We still had a shot at halftime, but we couldn't do it in the second half."

"We played well," O'Connor said, "even though we had a shaky beginning."

Reid led the Dawgs with 16 tackles in spite of breaking his nose on the game's first play. Someone stuck his foot into Reid's face mask, breaking his nose.

The injury shook Reid's composure at first, but he settled in "and we got rolling," O'Connor said. "We just wore them down."

Reid was 13/16/1 for 150 yards in the air and picked up 112 yards on the ground. Horinek was over 100 yards



rushing for his seventh consecutive game, going for 123 yards and three touchdowns. He also had 68 yards on six receptions, including a touchdown. These totals came despite Horinek's playing on a partially torn tendon in his foot. Arnberger had 60 yards on five receptions, including a touchdown.

Juenemann and J.R. Baird had eight

tackles apiece. Justin Jamison had six tackles and two sacks.

Brewster hosts Hanston, 3 p.m. Saturday, in the regional game. The game is a rematch of last year's sub-state game. Hanston won that contest and the state championship.

Weskan last won a district football title in 1995.

New coach means fresh start

MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP) — Everything from the coach to senior guard Galen Morrison's 4-inch puffy hairdo stresses a new beginning as Kansas State prepares for its 2000-01 season.

New coach Jim Wooldridge said Tuesday at the school's annual basketball media day that he wants to change the foundation of a program that has had just one NCAA Tournament appearance in the last seven years.

This season, that foundation includes new players, a new attitude, a new offense, a new defensive mentality and even a new scoreboard and floor.

Wooldridge, a Chicago Bulls assistant, replaced Tom Asbury after Asbury resigned in March.

Kansas State finished the 1999-2000 season in last place in the Big 12 with a 9-19 record, its worst finish since the 1945-46 season. Asbury's squad finished the year losing 15 of its last 16 games.

"It's a new beginning," Wooldridge said. "I told my coaches that we're building this program from ground zero. It's really a positive challenge for us to be able to do something from scratch."

Wooldridge said the rebuilding process starts with a solid foundation of attitude and hard work.

"You have nothing unless you have the foundation," Wooldridge said. "We stress a commitment of hard work, team concept and attitude. It's an every-day process. I think the players are making steps in the right direction."

Wooldridge inherited three starters, Travis Reynolds, Morrison and Kelvin Howell, but only five returning players have averaged more than 15 min-

utes a game at the Division I level.

Kansas State led the Big 12 in turnovers with 530, 124 more than their opponents.

Wooldridge hopes to eliminate that

problem with Northern Oklahoma Junior College transfer point guard Larry Reid.

Reid averaged 18.5 points and six assists a game for the Mavericks.
