## Youth can hunt birds early with adult supervision

This Saturday and Sunday is a time to hunt under less crowded conditions. for youth and their mentors to hunt tional opening day for the season. Youth 16 and younger may hunt under the supervision of an adult 21 or older this weekend. In order to participate, youth along so they could hunt. youth will need to have completed a hunter safety course. One supervising adult for each youth may also hunt. Daily bag limits are half what they are for the regular season.


