Youth can hunt birds early with adult supervision

This Saturday and Sunday is a time for youth and their mentors to hunt pheasants and quail prior to the traditional opening day for the season. Youth 16 and younger may hunt under the supervision of an adult 21 or older this weekend. In order to participate, youth will need to have completed a hunter safety course. One supervising adult for each youth may also hunt. Daily bag limits are half what they are for the regular season.

This is part of the new "Pass It On" program established by the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks. The program is designed to reverse the declining trend in hunting numbers. It takes a hunter to make a hunter and it is critical that youth learn important life lessons in the outdoors from experienced hunters. The early hunting season for youth will give them a chance

to hunt under less crowded conditions. The decision to allow one adult over 21 to hunt with one or more youth was a point of concern. Those against allowing adults to hunt with youth felt some adults would just be taking a youth along so they could hunt.

But the decision to allow one adult over 21 to hunt was based on the fact that the main objective of the program is to provide more opportunities for youth to hunt. The idea that more adults will take youth along if they can hunt means more youth will be able to participate.

Another concern was expressed that some hunters will take advantage of the early season and hunt without youth, but a few hunters already start the season early and the department does not set seasons based on what a few unethical hunters might do.
