Brewster falls to Hanston in first round of sub-state

Brewster High School's football season came to an abrupt halt Saturday as the two-time defending state champion Hanston Elks defeated the Bulldogs 40-16 in sub-state play.

It was a game of freakish plays from the beginning for the 9-2 'Dawgs. The Bulldogs kicked off against the wind to start the game, with the short kick going out of bounds close to mid-field.

Hanston declined a penalty and retained good field position.

The Elks moved the ball down the field on their first possession, scoring the touchdown and tacking on the conversion, giving them an 8-0 lead. Brewster was unable to do anything on their first offensive series, forcing the Bulldogs to punt.

Jay Reid was trying to keep the punt low due to the wind and instead it was

deflected, with Hanston grabbing it in the end zone for their second touchdown of the game. The conversion attempt failed, but an inadvertent face mask penalty was called on Brewster, and the Elks were successful on their second try, taking a 16-0 lead to end the first quarter.

The 'Dawgs' defense held tight the second quarter, with Brewster getting on the scoreboard right before half-time on a 15 yard run by Reid and a conversion pass from Reid to J.R. Baird. That cut the deficit to only 8 points going to the locker room.

The Bulldogs started the third quarter with the football. Reid passed behind the line of scrimmage to Clint Horinek, who couldn't pull the ball in. A Hanston player picked up the live ball and ran it in for the touchdown. Once again, the Elks scored on the conversion play.

Brewster did not give up. The

'Dawgs started to move the ball on their ensuing possession when Brett Arnberger broke loose going down field, catching a 36 yard Reid pass and being pulled down on the 2 yard line. On the very next play, Reid ran the ball in for the touchdown and connected on a pass to Brett Arnberger for the successful conversion, making the score 24-16 Hanston.

Then Elks marched right back down the field and scored eight more points to end the third quarter. In the fourth quarter, try as they might, the 'Dawgs just couldn't get anything to go quite right. Brewster was able to knock the ball loose as Hanston was in the red zone once again. Arnberger came up with the fumble recovery, but once again their defense held the Bulldogs back.

Reid connected with Horinek for a 32-yard pass but then was intercepted downfield attempting to go long on a

pass. Hanston scored once more in the fourth quarter for 40 points on the board. Brewster tried a short pass from Reid to Arnberger with Arnberger throwing downfield, to no avail, as Hanston took one more pick for the day.

Offensively, Reid rushed 16 times for 64 yards and two touchdowns, Horinek carried the ball 13 times for 51 yards and Arnberger got the call one time for 11 yards. Reid went 10-for-23 for 132 yards. Leading the receivers were Horinek with five carries for 51 yards, Arnberger had two for 43 yards, P.J. Crumbaker had two catches for 31 yards, and Travis Dixon had one catch for seven yards in the contest.

Defensively, Nick Juenemann had 18 tackles, Baird 17, Justin Jamison 16, Reid 14 tackles and an interception, and Arnberger had seven tackles and a fumble recovery.

Chiefs pile up yards, still lose to Raiders

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — While the Kansas City Chiefs piled up the yards, the Oakland Raiders piled up the points.

Elvis Grbac passed for a career-high and team-high 504 yards for Kansas City, but Oakland counterpart Rich Gannon threw for four touchdowns as the Raiders beat the Chiefs 49-31 Sunday.

It was the Raiders' sixth straight win overall and third straight over the Chiefs, and it gave Oakland (8-1) a three-game lead in the AFC West.

"This was a tough loss," Chiefs offensive lineman Donald Willis said. "They

couldn't stop our passing game, but they scored whenever they wanted to."

The Raiders (8-1) needed a dominating performance because their kicker, rookie Sebastian Janikowski, developed a bacterial infection in his foot and was unable to play.

Three weeks ago, Janikowski kicked a 43-yard field goal with 25 seconds left to give the Raiders a 20-17 victory over the Chiefs in Kansas City, the third straight meeting decided by a field goal.

Janikowski also kicked the game-winning against the San Diego Chargers last weekend.
