

# Kansas State beats Nebraska 29-28

If it's true that beating a good team twice in one year is the hardest thing to do in college football, Oklahoma has cause for worry.

No. 9 Kansas State, ranked No. 2 last month when the Sooners came into Manhattan and thrust themselves into the national picture with a 41-31 victory, is one win away from the Big 12 North title.

No. 1 Oklahoma is one win away from capturing the championship of the Big 12 South.

The two are almost certain to collide on Dec. 2 in the Big 12 championship game.

And since the Kansas City area is packed with Kansas State fans, the crowd in Arrowhead Stadium will be distinctly pro-Wildcats.

It'll be the closest thing to a home game the Wildcats could hope for outside of their own KSU Stadium, where a record crowd braved snow and sleet Saturday night to see them beat then-

No. 4 Nebraska 29-28. The Huskers dropped in Sunday's new poll to No. 10.

"It's very satisfying," said Kansas State defensive end Chris Johnson. "Really, it's big-time. We heard all the stuff that we aren't the team we used to be. We just wanted to shut everyone up and show that we could play the type of game we know how."

As much as anything, the Wildcats (9-2, 5-2 Big 12) wanted to silence those critics who have been laughing at their 1-18 record against top 10 opponents.

Now, after driving 62 yards for the winning TD in the final three minutes, they're 2-18 and feeling much better about themselves.

## 49ers knock down Chiefs, snap five-game streak

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Lance Schulters knocked down the Kansas City Chiefs, and Charlie Garner ran over them.

Garner rushed for 102 yards and a touchdown, and Schulters led an inspired defensive effort as the San Francisco 49ers snapped their five-game losing streak with a 21-7 win over Kansas City on Sunday.

Improbably, San Francisco's defense — the league's worst in six statistical categories — thoroughly dominated Kansas City's offense, which had scored 109 points in its last three games.

The Chiefs (5-5) gained just 107 yards in the first half and needed Donnell Bennett's 1-yard TD run with 6:27 left to avoid being shut out for the first time in 101 games.

Schulters, a Pro Bowl safety last year and the leader of the 49ers' league-worst secondary, made seven tackles and set the San Francisco defense's physical tone with two vicious hits on



receivers Derrick Alexander and Sylvester Morris.

Both receivers were briefly knocked out of the game by the hits, and Schulters continued to play despite nerve problems in his neck and left leg. San Francisco held Kansas City to 290 total yards, and the offense that threw for a team-record 504 yards last week in Oakland couldn't penetrate the league's worst pass defense.

## Jayhawks left with what-ifs

LAWRENCE (AP) — Texas and Kansas both had to come away from this one with what-ifs.

What if the No. 14 Longhorns had played like this against No. 1 Oklahoma? Perhaps they, not the Sooners, would be zeroing in on the Big 12 South title with one game left in the regular season.

And what if Kansas' special teams hadn't fallen apart in the Jayhawks' season opener against Southern Methodist? They'd still have one last shot at a bowl bid.

At least the Longhorns had the satisfaction of watching Hodges Mitchell set a career rushing high for a second straight week, seeing a promising freshman catch long passes almost at will — and coming back from an early 14-0 deficit to rout the Jayhawks 51-16 on Saturday.

"I'm very proud of my team," said Texas coach Mack Brown, whose Longhorns (8-2, 6-1 Big 12) won their fifth straight game. "They had a hard game today and they could have easily been flat. There is no one in the stands, KU was fighting for a bowl game and it was cold, so it would have been natural for us to take today off. We kept fighting."

Kansas (4-6, 2-5), which will miss the postseason for the fourth time in Terry Allen's four years as head coach, still faces a fight to match last year's total of five wins.

The Jayhawks, losers of three straight, travel to Iowa State for Saturday's season finale. At 7-3, the Cyclones will be Kansas' fourth bowl-qualified opponent in as many weeks — and the Jayhawks have only one Big 12 road win under Allen.
