Several starters may have new positions to fill

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) - Tony Gonzalez and Derrick Alexander, two key ingredients in Kansas City's rejuvenated passing attack, may have new jobs when the Chiefs meet Buffalo on

Sunday They, and perhaps a few other starters on offense and defense, may join the punt-return team — a weak spot since returner Tamarick Vanover was released last spring after being implicated in a federal investigation into a drug and stolen-car ring.

Coach Gunther Cunningham said Wednesday he was also thinking about putting safety Jerome Woods and cornerback James Hasty on the puntreturn team.

"We've got to get our best players on there." Cunningham said. In another move, Cunningham said
