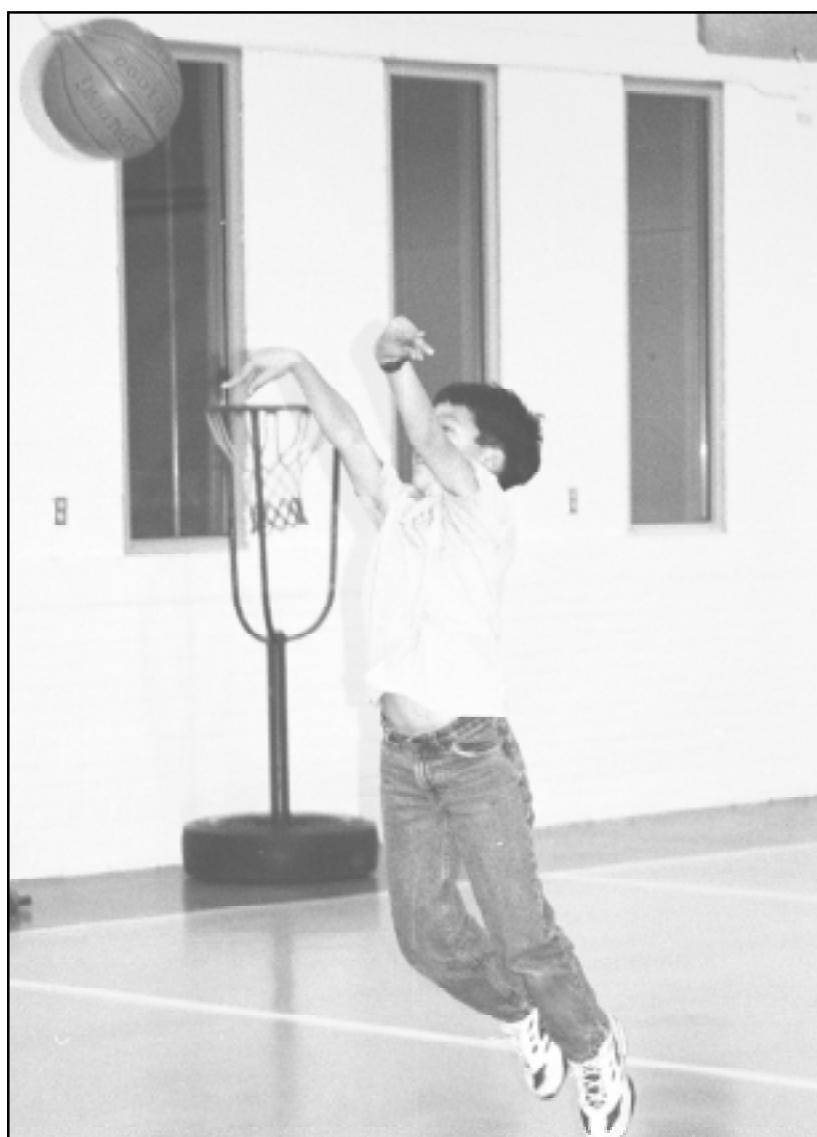

Coyotes find offense, beat Avalanche

PHOENIX (AP) — The Phoenix Coyotes finally found some offense against an unlikely opponent.

Keith Tkachuk scored two power-play goals, and Trevor Letowski had a goal and two assists as the Coyotes snapped Colorado's six-game unbeaten streak with a 6-3 victory over the Avalanche on Thursday night.

After scoring just 13 goals in their first seven games this month, even the Coyotes were surprised by their success against the streaking Avalanche.

"It was nice," said Tkachuk, who took over the NHL lead with nine power-play goals. "We didn't expect it, but we were going at the net, battling and everything, and they were going in."

Phoenix beat Patrick Roy and the Avalanche 4-0 in Denver on Oct. 30 and continued to manhandle Colorado goaltending by handing 22-year-old Swiss rookie David Aebischer his first NHL loss (4-1-0).

Aebischer allowed five goals in his first four starts, but stopped just 22 of

Phoenix's 28 shots.

Coach Bob Hartley defended Aebischer, Roy's heir apparent.

"He kept battling until the end," Hartley said. "The Coyotes were more opportunistic than us, and that is the story of the game."

Phoenix goalie Sean Burke made 18 saves.

The Avalanche allowed an NHL-best eight second-period goals in their first 19 games, but Landon Wilson, Tkachuk and Letowski all scored in the second for Phoenix.
