Chiefs' quarterback injures finger

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP)-Ouarterback Elvis Grbac's right index finger was in a splint Monday, and Kansas City Chiefs coach Gunther Cunningham did not sound overly optimistic that he'll be available for Sunday's game at San Diego.

"We'll see. It will probably show up Wednesday or Thursday to see where he's at," Cunningham said. "The way the doctors told me what happened, I think the opportunity is there for him to play again."

Grbac, who passed for 341 yards and two touchdowns in Sunday's 21-17 loss to Buffalo, banged the finger into a Bills helmet.

His backup is Warren Moon, who turned 44 last Saturday and hasn't played but a few snaps in two years.

The loss was the Chiefs' third in a row and plunged them to 5-6, to the highly unlikely the Chiefs will reach outer circle of the NFL's playoff hopefuls.

But anybody who feels like quitting will have to answer to center Tim Grunhard.

"If I see anybody quitting or hanging their head down or getting ready for an early Christmas, I'm going to (make sure they don't)," Grunhard said.

"I don't know what the future holds for me but I know I'm going to keep playing as hard as I can for the next five games. And I'll make sure everybody else does. You can have my word on that.'

Intense as always, the team captain and 11-year veteran seemed near tears after the loss.

Though not impossible, it's now the postseason.

In order to get there for the first time since 1997, they might need to win all five of remaining games — at San Diego, New England and Atlanta and home against Carolina and Denver.

Cunningham characterized the team as "upbeat" after its third straight defeat.

"I think the mood of the players is really positive," he said. "They're all hurting.

'Everybody was after the game. But I think they understand what we're doing and where we're heading. As long as we keep playing that hard, l think we'll be successful."
