Last week was a difficult play, with San Diego's close loss to the Broncos

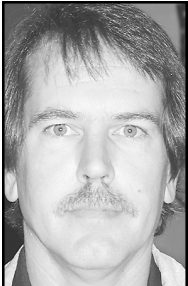
leaving them 0-11, and Tampa Bay's loss to Chicago.

GREAT BEND (AP)—When Mike Cargill bought Bob and Carol Martin's house, he didn't just get a new home. He got a whole way of life.

In the nearly 25 years they occupied their log home just south of Great Bend, the Martins had created an elaborate Christmas display.

Christmas Fantasy Village, as the Martins call it, drew 27,000 carloads of people last year. For \$1 per person,

visitors can ride a small train gaze and gawk at tens of thousands of colored lights and hand-feed miniature deer.

In January, Bob Martin, 56, was diagnosed with prostate cancer.

Cargill, 44, bought the entire property. He has been instrumental in setting up the city's own "Trail of Lights."

He spends his days making sure the city's Christmas lights function, then rushes home to the Fantasy Village.
