## **Cowboys take a fall**

Goodland Dailv News The McCook Bison (4-1) had a habit of letting their opponent hang around through two or three quarters, then exploding to win.

They did it in the first two rounds of the Topside Tipoff this weekend, then again in the final round. Goodland (2-2) stayed with McCook well into the third quarter, but the Bison exploded late in that period.

They went on to win 65-46 to take Tipoff's title for the third straight year.

McCook opened with an 8-2 lead before Goodland rallied. The Cowboys' Matt Mentzer scored a free throw, then Luke Stone hit a trey. Stone then found Mentzer for a fast-break layup to close the gap at 8-8. The game was so close early that there were seven ties through 4:48 of the third.

The teams both ran up and down the floor well and scored well, but Goodland got into foul trouble. Luke Stone and Andrew Melia kept replacing each other to save fouls, but both had about the same amount — way too many.

The Cowboys still pressed on. They took their first lead of the game on Stone's free throw, the third quarter's first score. McCook got it back on Kyle Carmichael's layup, but Mentzer's old-fashioned three-point play gave the lead to Goodland again. Melia's two free throws gave Goodland a fourpoint lead.

Mentzer and Stone were named to the all-tournament team. Goodland's Jordan Riebel won the three-point shooting contest. The Goodland High band won the tourney's spirit award. Goodland will play Quinter at home Friday, the final game before Christmas break.
