Both mothers and children were interviewed on entry into the study, again two years after the initial interview and finally, about 10 years after the initial interview. Because the researchers followed the children through either adolescence or young adulthood something few studies have done before, they were able to collect data about whether and when the children began to abuse drugs.

Data was gathered on psychiatric and substance abuse disorders of parents; family environmental factors, such as divorce and family discord; and maternal factors, such as alcohol and coffee consumption and postnatal smoking; to rule out other explanations for the presence of drug abuse and conduct disorder.
