"I don't know why the people who live here would need a copy in their paper," said Commissioner Rick Billinger.

Ron Harding, executive director of the Goodland Chamber of Commerce and the visitor's bureau, explained that he was hoping the people who lived here would be the best sales people for the area.

"When people come to visit you," he said, "I would hope you would show them the guide."

He said the Daily News had offered to distribute the guide for free with their papers.

The city decided to buy an ad on the inside of the guide with color for \$560. Commissioner Curtis Hurd voted against it, saying if the commission was willing to pay \$560 for the ad, why not spend \$140 more to get an ad on the existing stores.

to call the city about changing the name on the account.

He also gave the commissioners the proposed dates for the stock car races next year. They want to try to start the races at 6:30 p.m., instead of 7 p.m., to try to get more drivers from the Central Time zone.

Frankenfeld asked if the new noise ordinance passed by the city would have an affect on the races. The ordinance calls for quiet in the city limits during 11 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Snethen said it wasn't a problem on the one-day races, but would be on the two-day races. He said the association would like to extend the time to midnight.

Frankenfeld said he would need to talk to the city about that because the fairgrounds are in the city limits.

Snethen said the racing association was having a problem with the speaker system in the grandstand area. He said people in the grandstands complain that they can't hear the announcer.

He asked if it was something that they needed to get and take down.

"Is this really old equipment," Frankenfeld asked.

Snethen said the association had installed new wiring to the speakers.

"Would you be willing to put some money into this, if we upgrade?" Rasure asked. Snethen said he would need to check with the rest of the board members
