BREWSTER — Brewster seemed poised to blow out the Sharon Springs boys Friday night. At the half, the Bulldogs led 49-20. But the Wildcats (0-5) gained in the second half. Still, the outcome was decisive 79-56 Brewster victory.  
In spite of early shooting troubles, the 'Dawgs (5-0) opened a 7-0 lead with scores from Justin Jamison and Jay Reid (a two- and a three-point bucket).  
'Cat Chance Rains scored their first bucket, a trey, then the 'Dawgs scored

the next eight.  
At first quarter's end, the score was already 22-8 in Brewster's favor.  
At halftime, the officials told Brewster coach Larry O'Connor that the 'Dawgs were doing a lot of pushing and shoving. O'Connor said he didn't believe his team was doing anything out of the ordinary.  
In the second half, though, the officials saw a lot of Brewster pushing and shoving. The 'Cats were in the bonus by 3:37 of the third. Finally, O'Connor reminded the officials that the 'Cats only had five fouls while the 'Dawgs had nine.

Sharon Springs' Aaron Wagoner finished with 19 points. He was 8-9 from the field. Kris Sharp scored 11, Chance Rains nine, Keith Rhea eight, Corey David seven and Braden Cox two.  
Brewster travels to Herndon on Tuesday night for December's final game, with the boys game set to start about 8 p.m. Central Time.

Bucs take their revenge on Rams 38-35

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) — Shaun King might have kept the St. Louis Rams from making the NFL playoffs.  
The Tampa Bay Buccaneers won a rematch of last season's NFC championship game 38-35 Monday night, clinching a playoff berth and pushing the defending Super Bowl champions to the brink of elimination.  
The Bucs (10-5) can still win the NFC Central with a victory at Green Bay on Sunday and a Minnesota loss at Indianapolis, but the Rams (9-6) need help to get back into the playoffs.  
"We came in with a purpose and a mind set that we had to get it done," Bucs defensive tackle Warren Sapp

said. "We kept punching them and we finally got a knockout. It's 'Bucsball,' baby. Whatever it takes."  
King hadn't thrown a touchdown pass in five games, but broke the drought with a pair to Keyshawn Johnson. It's what he did in the closing minutes the Bucs will remember.  
Trailing 35-31 and seemingly headed nowhere against the Rams defense, King threw a swing lateral to Warrick Dunn. He was trapped behind the line and, as he was being dragged down, suddenly pitched the ball back to King.  
King shook loose and streaked down the sideline for a 15-yard gain, and 15 more were tacked on for a late hit. Four


