

sports Bulldogs play everyone against Herndon

The Goodland Daily News HERNDON — In court, a plea of no contest is said to really mean, "I'm not guilty, judge, and I'll never do it again." But Tuesday night "no contest" had no subtext.

It was no contest on the court when No. 1 Brewster (6-0) played Herndon's boys basketball team (1-3). The game was over before the first quarter ended, and the final score was 86-25, Brewster.

Herndon actually led twice in the very early going. Brewster, appropriately, scored first on Justin Jamison's free throw. Then Herndon's Nik Martin followed Isaac Marintzer's miss to take a brief lead. Jamison then scored inside, but Herndon's Josh Allen followed Martin's miss. The score was 4-Herndon.

Jamison next put back Jay Reid's missed trey, starting a 19-0 Brewster run. The Bulldogs' full-court press harassed the Beavers into numerous turnovers. In the run, four Reid points came straight from steals, one for Reid and the other for Brett Arnberger. Many other Bulldog buckets came less directly from Beaver turnovers.

Brewster's J.R. Baird made the run's final bucket, putting back Bobby Tubbs' miss

Herndon finally broke its scoring drought with Dan Riener's very long two with less than a minute left in the first quarter.

Brewster flirted with a shut-out second quarter. Herndon did get a couple shots to bang off the rim, but mostly they never crossed the top of their key before Brewster had the ball again.

Finally, with 29.5 seconds left in the stop.' half, Jamison pushed Allen, who made both free throws.

Brewster coach Larry O'Connor ran the game as if it were a practice, telling his starters to play different positions than usual and running in bench players to play alongside some starters.

In that environment, Herndon scored almost as many points in the third as they did in the entire first half. 14, but that was of no real consequence to the Brewster margin, 68-14 at the end of three.

Brewster's bench played all the fourth quarter and every suited-up Bulldog had scored by game's end.

"I liked the way our subs played," O'Connor said. "J.R., John (Luckert) and Rob (Garner) played well and we need that. If they will be able to play 2-3 minutes a game to relieve our starters, that will make us better. And getting our young kids experience like we did tonight will help us down the road. That's what playing in blow outs can do for you - get young kids experience and enable experienced players to get time in different positions.'

Arnberger was just one steal, two assists and four rebounds from a quadruple double. He scored 10 points and tallied nine steals, eight assists and six rebounds. Reid led the 'Dawgs in scoring and rebounding with 17 points and seven rebounds. Jamison had 15 points and Clint Horinek scored 14. Baird and Garner were close to double figures with eight each. Rounding out 'Dawg scorers were Luckert (4), P.J. Crumbaker (3), Jarrett Carpenter (3), Tubbs (2) and Travis Dixon (2).

O'Connor concluded his post-game remarks by complimenting Jamison.
