

Mustangs win league title

The Goodland Mustangs eighth-grade basketball team took home a championship win when they traveled to Hoxie for the Northwest Kansas League basketball tournament.

The Mustangs won their first game against Colby 43-35 and won in the championship game against Hoxie 49-41.

“We ended our season by playing our best basketball of the year,” said the coach Terry Daise. “Our defense was excellent! Our boxing-out and rebounding were outstanding in both games.”

Seventh grade team is undefeated at 13-0

The seventh-grade Mustang basketball team won the Northwest Kansas League Junior High Playoffs on Thursday with a squeaker of Colby and an overtime victory against Oakley.

The Grant Junior High School traveled to Hoxie to take part in the play-off games, and the Mustangs ended their season with a 13-0 record.

In the first game, Goodland squeaked out a 28-26 victory over Colby. Adjusting to being without Bobby Miller—who was injured—the team got off to a slow start, said the coach Wallace Hansen. At halftime, the score was 11-11.

Jase Herl led scoring with 10 points, followed by Derek Fenner with seven and Jon Beeson with five. Fenner played his best game of the year with six rebounds, the coach said. Herl and Beeson each had eight rebounds to lead in that department.

The Mustangs forced 15 Colby turnovers. Nine players contributed to the victory in some way or another, said the coach.

In the championship game, playing Oakley for the third time this season, Goodland won in overtime 49-45. Getting off to a good start with 16 first-quarter points was important, said Hansen.

At halftime, Goodland led 31-21. In the second half, Oakley’s 6-1 forward-

High scorers for the first game were Derrick Raymer, who brought in 14 points for the team, Drew Wilkens with 12 and David Livengood with 11. Other scorers were Lane Winter, Breck Lohr, and Wade Taylor each with two points.

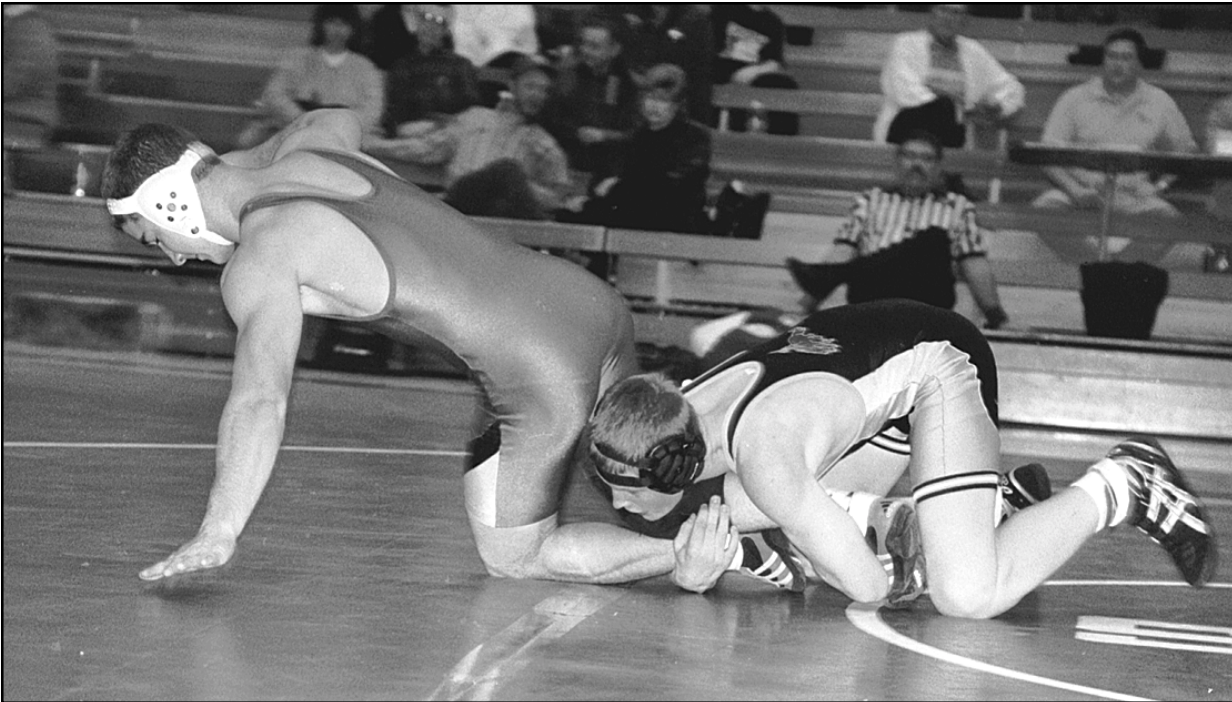
High rebounders were Wilkens with seven and Taylor with four. Other rebounders were Livengood, Winter, and Lohr (2), and Bret Jarmin and Jake Johnson (1).

Raymer led in steals with four followed by Lohr with two. Other contributors with steals were Livengood, Wilkens, and Jarmin with one a piece. Livengood and Winter each had two assists.

In the championship game lead scorers were Wilkens with 16 and Livengood with 11. Other scorers were Taylor (8), Lohr (6), Winter (5) and Jarmin (3).

Leading rebounders were Lohr with ten Wilkens with seven and Taylor with six. Other rebounders were Livengood (3), Raymer (2), and Winter and Jarmin (1).

Winter led in steals with two followed by Livengood and Johnson with one apiece and in assists. Winter led again with four followed by Jarmin and Taylor with one apiece.

Miller said he has played the contest since it started.

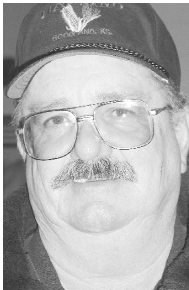
He said he didn’t really expect to win and that it was a big surprise when he received a call from Sheila Smith, office manager at *The Goodland Daily News*.

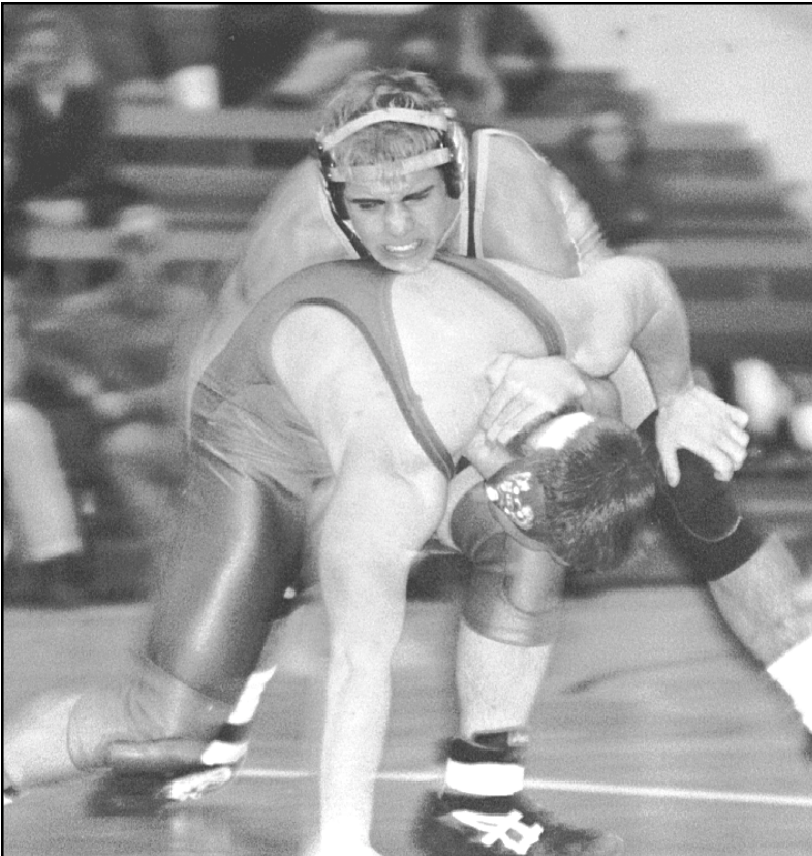
Basler entered the contest through *The Press-Spectator* in Salisbury.
