Leading scorers for Goodland were Jase Herl with 23 points, Jon Beeson with 11 and Wyatt Dautel with 11. Dautel hit a key layup in overtime to ice the victory, said Hansen.

Herl was outstanding in the game, he said, scoring, rebounding and on defense. Beeson led rebounding with 11, while Herl, Dautel and Fenner chipped in with five, four, and four rebounds respectively. Brandon Zelfer played exceptionally well on defense, said Hansen, and hit two driving layups in the fourth quarter to aid the cause.

"The bench played well, enabling the starters to get needed rest during the game," he said.

These games were the 12th and 13th wins of the season for the seventhgrade Mustang team.

"Some of the victories were hard earned, some were one-sided," said Hansen, "but the team played hard and gave an outstanding effort. The league's divisional and playoff championships were the reward for all the hard work."
