

Man breaks into cockpit, hurts five

NAIROBI, Kenya (AP) — A passenger burst into the cockpit of a British Airways jet with 398 people aboard and grabbed the controls, sending the plane on a wild ride of dips and dives Friday before passengers and crew subdued him. Airline officials are calling the attack a suicide attempt.

The man, identified only as a 27-year-old Kenyan, forced the Boeing 747-400 into two violent nosedives, terrifying passengers on the flight from London to Nairobi and injuring five people, airline officials said.

Most of the 379 passengers aboard Flight 2069 were asleep or watching a movie when the man burst into the cockpit and grabbed the controls. Passengers screamed and the engines roared as the plane plummeted an estimated 10,000 feet, witnesses said.

"There was this awful lurching, it felt like turbulence, but with this horrible noise, it was like a roller coaster, when the pit of your stomach drops out," said Zanne Augur, 32, a graduate student at the University of South Carolina in Columbia. "But you could tell it wasn't turbulence, it was fierce movement."

city charges," said Schroller.

Pickman said the city wouldn't be able to buy a new truck or hire a new person to cover Wal-Mart, so the trash service probably wouldn't be as good as they are getting now if the city took over.

Schroller questioned whether the city really would make the \$5,400 profit they are charging Butts if it was handling the service.

Commissioner Jim Mull said the reason the city took over the trash service in the first place was so they could regulate the cost of trash hauling and make sure that all residents were getting their trash removed.

He said their goal was never to make a profit on it, but they would lose money that would be going into the solid waste budget by not hauling the trash for Wal-Mart and that is why the city charged the fee.

"The city taking over the trash disposal was one of the things that I pushed for," said Mull, "and it's something I have thought twice about."

Butts said he offered to take the trash service off of the city's hands many times.

Commissioner Curtis Hurd said he would be in favor of turning it over to Butts.

"The trash is not a thorn in our side," he said.

Mull said if Butts is serious, he should come up with a financial plan to present to the city.

In the meantime, Pickman said, Wal-Mart and Butts could come to the commission when they consider the budget in August and might have a better chance of getting the fee lowered.

Liquor stores not selling on New Year's Eve

Year's fell on a Sunday.

Ernie Workman, owner of Workman Retail Liquor, said he wasn't concerned about the holiday.

"This happens once in awhile," he said.

He said he does expect sales to be down from the average for New Year's.

Workman said he thought most people would come in on Saturday.

New Year's Eve is traditionally one of the busiest days of the year for retail liquor store owners, said Scott Holeman, communications director with the office of the Kansas Secretary of State.

But not this year, he said, with state law requiring liquor stores to be closed on Sundays.

The Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control is warning that any liquor licensee that violates the law and remains open would be subject to license revocation.

Missouri and Nebraska allow sales on Sunday, but it is against the law to transport liquor across the state line. The transportation would be a misdemeanor crime punishable by fines up to \$500 and jail time, he said.

Drinking establishments and clubs are permitted to remain open on Sundays, though, so people can also go out or plan ahead for parties.

Oberlin woman faces charges of aiding escape and illegal sex

OBERLIN — A former youth ranch employee was arrested last week on six counts of aiding an escape and unlawful sexual relations in incidents which allegedly occurred at the ranch from April 3 to June 9.

Joan Faye Evans, 55, was charged with two counts of aiding in the escape of Todd Lloyd and Robert Prebble from the city-owned Sappa Youth ranch on June 9 and four counts of sexual relations with Prebble, who was 17 at the time.

According to police reports, the two boys supposedly were dropped off at their job at a cabinet shop at 6:45 a.m. on June 9.

Around 11 a.m., the ranch was notified that neither had showed up for work.

Sappa Valley is a residential facility for juvenile offenders rather than a locked facility, said Terry Campbell, vice president in charge of operations for Clarence M. Kelley Youth Services, which runs the home for the City of Oberlin.

Reports at the time indicated that the boys, who were from Hutchinson, had been picked up there before the end of June. They were not returned to the ranch.

Kelley officials were notified of the allegations of sexual misconduct by a case manager in Reno County, Mr. Campbell said. The allegations stem from remarks made by one of the youths, he said.

Once the allegation was made, Kelley officials immediately notified law enforcement officials and the Juvenile Justice Department, he said.

Mrs. Evans, who worked part-time on the weekday evening shift, was hired on April 3. After the allegations were made, she was suspended without pay on June 15. On July 26, Mr. Campbell said, she resigned.

Sometime in the last summer, Kansas Bureau of Investigation agents came to Oberlin under the direction of the state attorney general's office. Sheriff Ken Badsy said the agents kept the investigation very quiet.

A complaint was filed last Wednesday, Dec. 20, by Melissa G. Johnson, an assistant attorney general, and on Thursday a warrant was issued by Magistrate Judge John Bremer.

Mrs. Evans was arrested Thursday afternoon by the Oberlin police and booked into the Decatur County Jail. She made her first appearance before Judge Bremer and was released on a \$15,000 personal recognizance bond that same day.


She is scheduled for a preliminary hearing at 1 p.m. Tuesday in District Court.

All the charges are felonies. The first two allege aiding an escape from custody of the Juvenile Justice Authority. The next four charges involve unlawful sexual relations, one of "lewd fondling," one of sodomy and two, which appear to be identical, of consensual sexual intercourse.
