the school year's start, falling from about 1,171 to 1,155. Selby blames the decline on families moving to bigger cities, students graduating mid-year and students dropping out.

The Goodland District is steadily losing students each year, as are most districts in Kansas. School board members have discussed future changes to accommodate a smaller student body which means less money from the state—like combining the junior high and high school.

Members will discuss dropping out of the Interactive Television program at the high school, which the district pays \$24,000 a year for, but benefits no students here.

The board talked about ending the program, where students can tune into classes taught at other schools, at a previous meeting after hearing that the district's five-year agreement with Southwestern Bell, which provides the service, ended in January.
