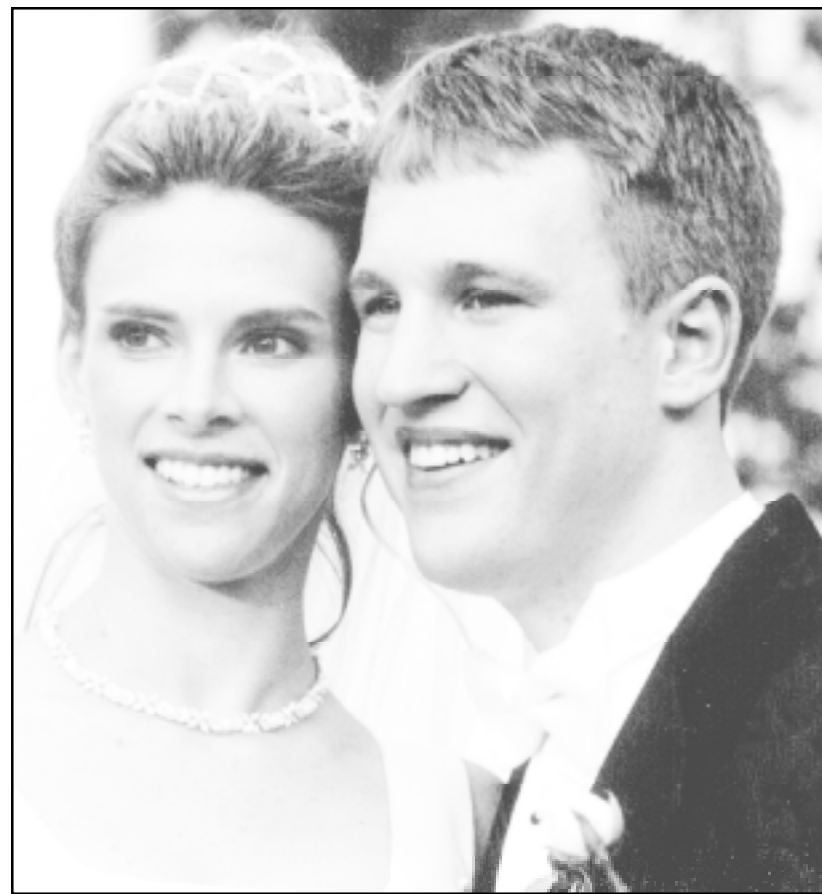

write-in candidate Tiede in November. Commissioner Chuck Frankenfeld, vice chairman, has been filling in as chairman at the county meetings.

The commission will approve resolutions for legal publications for county business and legal depositories for county funds.

Mary Messamore, emergency

management coordinator, is scheduled to talk to the commission about appointing an assistant coordinator.

The commissioners are to sign a fairgrounds lease with the Sherman County Racing Association, which uses the racetrack at the fairgrounds during the summer.

In closed session, the commissioners will discuss who to hire for the position of county administrator. Fi-

nalists are Tom Betz of Goodland, an editor for *The Goodland Daily News*, and Roy Ridener of Wichita, who retired after a 21-year career in the U.S. Army to earn a degree in business administration, followed by a master's degree in both public administration and business administration from Wichita State University.

Karen Hooker, director of the Northwest Kansas Emergency Medical Service, will be joined by Jeff Krall, paramedic, and Gary Winter, emergency medical technician and Region 1 director of emergency medical services, to give an overview of the ambulance department and discuss future needs of the service.
