



Chiefs name defensive coach

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — It's one coordinator down and one to go for new Kansas City coach Dick Vermeil. Vermeil introduced former Denver coach Greg Robinson as his defensive coordinator Monday and said he's still waiting for permission from the St. Louis Rams to talk to Al Saunders about becoming offensive coordinator. "I don't think it will take much longer," Vermeil said. Tensions may still be a bit tight between the two clubs. The Rams and Chiefs had to take their dispute over compensation for hiring Vermeil to the

NFL commissioner, who ordered Kansas City to give up a second- and a third-round draft pick. Vermeil said he does not expect any problems in getting permission to talk to Saunders, a member of the St. Louis staff the past four years and a longtime assistant coach in Kansas City. Robinson, 49, replaces Kurt Schottenheimer, who was dismissed along with most of Gunther Cunningham's staff. He said he would like to return to the aggressive man-to-man coverage which once characterized the Chiefs defense.

"I think man-to-man is critical in this league," Robinson said. "I like bump-and-run coverage. It depends on your personnel. But if you're in man-to-man coverage, you put yourself in position to be aggressive." Robinson declined to say what he has in mind for the Chiefs, who were 4-0 against the Broncos the past two years under Cunningham. "I think before I say anything about these players, I have to sit down and go through an evaluation," he said. "I've studied the Chiefs offense a lot more than I have the Chiefs defense."

Tigers play K-State after epic

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Kansas State and Missouri have played basketball 212 times but never once when the Tigers were coming off a four-overtime epic. "I hope they're tired," deadpanned Kansas State head coach Jim Wooldridge. If the Tigers are mentally and physically fatigued for their Tuesday night appearance in Kansas State's Bramlage Coliseum, who could blame them? They'll only be about 50 hours removed from playing the longest game in the school's 95-year basketball history. When the four-overtime thriller finally ended, Missouri had a 112-109 victory over defending Big 12 champion Iowa State and plenty of reason to be tired. "We got together yesterday and lifted weights and watched the game and kind of let it roll through," Missouri coach Quin Snyder said Monday. "You worry about your team being physically and emotionally drained," Snyder said. "We'll be all right. But there's always concern when you expend that much emotional energy in a game. The best thing to do is talk about it, and we did."

One thing boosting their spirits might be this week's Associated Press poll, which has the Tigers (12-3, 3-0 Big 12) No. 20. It's the first time they've been ranked since Quin Snyder took over for Norm Stewart following the 1998-99 season. In Snyder's second year, the Tigers are clearly a team on the move. "We want to break into the upper echelon of the league," said Snyder. "I would like to see this team grow enough that we can compete night in and night out with the top teams in this league, teams that have proven they belong there." Wooldridge terms the Tigers "a team that's upward bound." "You have to respect their ability. They're playing hard. It looks like they're gaining confidence as the season goes along." Kansas State (7-7 overall, 1-2 Big 12) is coming off a 63-55 home loss on Saturday to Baylor. The Wildcats, who have been having trouble scoring, will need to find a

way to keep Kareem Rush and Clarence Gilbert from beating them beyond the 3-point arc. Gilbert scored 43 points against Iowa State, tying the record for a Big 12 game. "It definitely boosts our confidence beating the league champs," said Rush. "It gives us great confidence to go into Manhattan and go 4-0, and then 5-0 and everything." Stopping the Tigers' 3-point barrage will be paramount for the Wildcats. "We've been a solid defensive team statistically," said Wooldridge. "But the 3-point line has hurt us."
