He said the fireball entered the earth's atmosphere in the northwestern part of the sky over the Rocky Mountains and traveled southeast toward

Because the meteorite most likely flew close enough to the earth to significantly light up the ground, Murphy said, it's called a "fireball." He said he labeled the meteorite "stony," because it didn't last long once it hit the earth's atmosphere.

"It looks like it may have burned up landed it was probably over eastern in the atmosphere," he said. "These Colorado or western Kansas where the little pieces of asteroid are fryable."

He said meteorites made of metal are more durable than "stony" meteorites, which are made of rock.




