Brewster's Jay Reid and Quinter's Matt Seidl both rained three-pointers in the fourth quarter, but Brewster prevailed, 81-76. The western Bulldogs had to come from behind to win. Both teams are now 11-1.

The game was as exciting as a meeting between No. 1 (Brewster in Class 1A) and No. 2 (Quinter in 2A) should be.

Brewster led by six at the end of the first quarter, perhaps lulling the boys into too much confidence. And they were troubled by illness.
