## clarification

An article in Thursday's *Goodland Daily News* said total spending on professional fees at Goodland Regional Medical Center had gone from \$493,198 to \$461,156 last year. The total amount included physician emergency room call pay, legal fees, auditing fees, outside consultants, air charter service and contracted laboratory procedures, as well as fees for two or more anesthesiologists, hospital officials said. Some readers apparently read the paragraph to mean that the entire amount had gone for anesthesiologists fees, but that is not correct.
