balance?" he asked.
Ward said they have collected about \$14,000 in pledges so far to go towards the purchase of the house and have set up an account at Western State Bank. She said they are to also receive some money from two trust funds and are still taking donations. They have until the last of February to give an answer on the house.
Ward said Rod Cooper, a Goodland businessman, had promised to furnish the Handy house in period antiques for as long as the society needs them. Then if the society receives donations or is able to buy furnishings, he will take the antiques back.
Grants are available for preserving

or restoring a house, Ward said.
If the society gets both houses, she said, it will take a professional to run them.
Rasure asked if there was something the commissioners could do as far as the county records.
Ward said it would be good if some sort of system could be established for indexing county records stored at the old telephone building.
"School records are first priority," she added.
She said the society has been working on school records for three years and with over 100 schools which once operated in the county, they have 26 done.
Commissioner Chuck Frankenfeld said the county is looking at having

records put on microfilm and then transferred to compact disks, or CDs.
"We're waiting on some prices," he said.
Ward said it would be good to have records on disks, but they would also like to have the records typed.
The commissioners approved the list of recommended Sherman County Convention and Visitors Bureau board members for this year.

Body identified

WICHITA (AP) — For eight years after two young boys found a human skull in a pasture south of the Augusta Airport, the case haunted investigators.
The boys' discovery on March 13, 1992, led to the finding of other human remains. The victim had been bound with a rope and shot. His body was partially clothed with a pair of blue jeans and shoes. No one claimed the body.
Capt. Craig Murphy of the Butler County Sheriff's Department could not dismiss the case. He spent much of his time poring over missing persons reports.
With the help of other law enforcement agencies, the Butler County Sheriff's Department now knows that it was Julio Torres who died in 1991 from a gunshot wound.
