TULSA (AP)-Friends and family members turned out in force to share tears and laughs at the first four funerals of the 10 men killed in Saturday's crash of a plane carrying members of the Oklahoma State basketball pro-

An estimated 2,000 mourners crowded inside Foster-Piper Fieldhouse in Tonkawa on Thursday to celebrate the life of Jared Weiberg, who played junior-college basketball in the gym under his father, Northern Oklahoma coach Mick Weiberg.

Members of the OSU athletic department attended the ceremony, including head coach Eddie Sutton and associate head coach Sean Sutton.

Weiberg, 22, was a walk-on on the OSU team in 1998-99 and later became student manager. As the youngest of three brothers, he cherished learning and playing the sport under his father.

"Every time I saw him, I got a hug," said Weiberg friend Ryan Morgan, who shared stories about Weiberg at the service.

In Oklahoma City, an overflow crowd of 2,000 people filled the main church sanctuary, chapel, social hall and three Sunday School classrooms at Westminster Presbyterian Church to pay their respects to Nate Fleming.

Fleming, a walk-on, was one of two the podium. players killed in the crash. The other was Dan Lawson.

Fleming was eulogized by his personal tennis coach, Rick Lashley, close friend Mason Zabel and OSU President James Halligan in the 90-minute ceremony, which was attended by all the men's basketball team members.

Lashley remembered "the cute little kid" Fleming was when they were introduced to each other seven years ago. It didn't surprise him, he said, that his pupil turned out to be successful in any endeavor.

"He was the picture of hard work," Lashley said. "He truly wanted to be the best at everything he did."

Several OSU officials, including Eddie Sutton and Halligan, attended morning funeral services for director of basketball operations Pat Noyes, 27, at the OSU Catholic Student Center.

"The thing I remember the most about Pat was his great smile and his upbeat, positive attitude about life," Sutton said following the service. "He was just a beautiful child and a beautiful man."

An estimated 700 people crowded into the service.

Noyes' father, Dan Noyes, was choked with emotion as he stepped to

"My son visited me last night, and he told me to tell (former OSU basketball player) Alex Webber to graduate or he would haunt him," Noyes said with a smile. "He also said one more thing. 'Beat the hell out of KU.'

DENVER (AP) — Statements Denver Broncos linebacker Bill Romanowski made to federal drug agents have been read their rights. He claims should be thrown out because he was not read his Miranda rights, his attorney said in court papers.

Romanowski is accused of illegally obtaining the appetite suppressant phentermine, which was prescribed for his wife and a friend. He is charged with one count each of unlawful possession of a controlled substance and obtaining a controlled substance by fraud and deceit and two counts of conspiracy.

The motions, which were filed in mid-January and made available this week, closely mirror those of Romanowski's wife, Julie. She had asked a judge to dismiss eight counts of illegally obtaining diet pills and one count of conspiracy against her.

In Bill Romanowski's motion, his attorney, Harvey Steinberg, claims federal agents entered the Romanowski home on Aug. 21, 1999, and separated the two for questioning.
