Missouri prepares for Kansas State

AP Sports Writer Just like the first time around, Missouri's rematch against Kansas State Wednesday night in Columbia, Mo., comes on one day's rest and after an emotional game.

Beating Missouri hasn't turned out to be a momentum builder for the Wildcats, who have lost four in a row and six of seven. Four of the losses were to ranked teams, however.
