Cowgirls behind early, come back to win, 46-31

HUGOTON — Winless Hugoton stayed that way Monday afternoon, but not without putting an early scare into the Goodland Cowgirls.

They were down 6-0 early before coming back to win the makeup contest in the southwest Kansas town by 15, 46-31.

Goodland opened the game shooting 0-6 from the field before Cowgirl Jara McKee found Ashley Hallagin to put the Cowgirls on the scoreboard. Erica Mann then put back Lacey Brenner's missed free throw and StevieLee Raymer found Anny McCoy to tie the game.

Hugoton's Stephanie Hall broke the tie with a 10-footer, but Goodland responded with a 6-0 run. Mann scored twice in the run and got a steal to set up the third bucket, a pass from Cody Pettibone to Jayci Stone. The Cowgirls

ended the first quarter up 12-8.

Hugoton came within two as the second quarter opened on two Allison Owens free throws, but four straight McKee points put Goodland out of danger for good.

The Cowgirls ran away from the Eagles in the middle quarters. By the end of three, Goodland led 37-19. Hugoton cut the margin by three by game's end, but that didn't matter.

McCee led Cowgirl scorers with 13, followed by Stone with 11. Mann scored eight, McCoy seven, Ashley Hallagin five and Brenner two. Raymer pulled down seven rebounds, while Hallagin, Stone and McCoy got five. The girls improved their record to 11-4, 4-0 against possible sub-state opponents.

Cowgirls travel to Oakley on Friday for a 5:30 p.m. game and go to Wray Saturday for a 4:30 tipoff. All times are Mountain.

Cowboyssee victory slip away

HUGOTON — Sometimes victory is like a wet bar of soap. You think you have a good grip on it, then it slips out of your hands.

Victory was just like that Monday night for the Goodland Cowboys. Although they led through much of the game, victory slipped away in the last half of the fourth quarter, and Goodland lost the makeup contest to Hugoton 58-52.

The Cowboys led by 10 with 2 minutes left in the third quarter on four Luke Stone free throws. Then Hugoton had a 12-0 run to start the fourth quarter, going up 41-38.

Cowboy Matt Mentzer started a 6-0 Goodland run with a layup, followed by Jeremy Stefan's putback and Jordan Riebel's score inside. Hugoton then took a one-point lead on consecutive buckets, but two Riebel free throws put Goodland on top again, 46-45, with 4 minutes to go.

Hugoton then ran off a 6-2 run to take a three-point lead, 51-48. A Stone free throw cut the margin back to two, then Hugoton scored again. Stone hit a trey and was fouled. He

missed the free throw that would have tied the game at 53 with just over a minute remaining. Stefan fouled on the rebound. The ensuing possession resulted in a Hugoton layup and the Eagles were up by three, 55-52, with 47 seconds left.

Goodland had to foul and Hugoton hit 3 of 4 from the line in the final 30 seconds. Goodland got the defensive rebound on the fourth free throw, but Riebel missed a trey. Hugoton got the rebound to end the game.

Cowboys fell to 6-9, and are 0-2 against possible sub-state opponents.

Mentzer led the Cowboys with 14 points and 13 rebounds. Stone had 13 points and nine rebounds. Riebel scored 11. Other Cowboy scorers were Lee McCoy and Stefan (4), Nate Thompson and Aaron Gittinger (3). the Cowboys out-rebounded Eagles 40-32, but had eight more turnovers. The Eagles also out-shot the Cowboys 52.3 percent to 48.4 percent.
