The Brewster boys won their fourth Western Kansas Liberty League title by defeating the Weskan Coyotes on the road Thursday night.

This was a rescheduled game after the original date was postponed due to weather. The Bulldogs defeated the home team 78-54 to bring the league title home once again.

Brewster jumped out to a 9-2 lead, and at one time led 20-9, but Weskan battled back to within six points before the end of the first quarter.

With 5 seconds on the clock, P.J. Crumbaker threw the ball to Jay Reid at the top of the circle, who then drove for the basket and dished off to Brett Arnberger on the left wing. He drained a trey at the buzzer to give the Bulldogs the 23-14 lead.

The second quarter was more of the same, with Brewster extending its lead by tossing in 19 points while Weskan added 18, giving the Bulldogs a 10-point lead at half time, 42-32.

Brewster's defense took over in the third quarter, with the 'Dawgs only allowing Weskan 8 points. On the of-
