# Loss ends Brewster girls season

BREWSTER — For the second-straight year, Cheylin ended the Brewster girls' season in the first round of regional play with a 43-39 loss.

Cheylin opened Monday's game with a 5-0 lead on a Brandee Mears trey and a 10-footer by Jill Zumbahlen.

Brewster didn't fold, though. The girls battled back, and at the half, the Bulldogs took a 24-20 lead when Miranda Starns and Erin Carney hit back-to-back buckets.

The Cougars came back to tie the game at 30 when Joy Zumbahlen put back Sara Moore's miss as the buzzer sounded to end the third.

The fourth quarter seemed destined to end in overtime, with the score tied four times.

At 3:37 in the fourth, Brewster's Alicia Collett made a free throw, followed by a Christi Somers bucket inside. The 'Dawgs led by three with 3:04 remaining.

Then Collett blocked Moore, who made her second free throw to bring Cheylin within two, 39-37, with 2:06 to go.

Collett had a chance to extend the 'Dawgs' lead back to three, but she missed the free throw on Cheylin's seventh team foul. Cheylin brought down the rebound.

With just under a minute to go, Brewster's Amber Fulwider held Moore for Brewster's seventh team foul.

Moore made both free throws for the game's final tie.

Bulldog coach Laura Rush would have preferred her girls to shoot from inside, but Starns tried and missed a 19-footer. The Cougars got the rebound again.

"I hoped we'd have better shots at the end," Rush said.

Brewster's Ashley Carpenter then held Moore, who made both her free throws.

Starns tried for three on Brewster's

ensuing possession and missed. Cheylin's Patty Hengen got the board. Starns fouled out when she held Moore. Moore missed her free throw and Brewster got the board.

Bulldog Jill Beiser missed a 12-footer, but the rebound went out of bounds off Cheylin. On the inbounds play, Carpenter tried and missed from the baseline. Hengen got another defensive board. Beiser then pushed Mears, who made both her free throws. Cheylin led by four, 43-39, with 6.2 seconds left.

Brewster still had just enough wiggle room to pull off a victory if everything went right. It didn't. Fulwider hit a layup and Joy Zumbahlen pushed her, the Cougars' eighth team foul. Instead of counting the bucket and sending Fulwidwer to the line for a chance at a three-point play, the officials ruled that the foul came just before the shot.

Fulwider still had a chance to get the 'Dawgs within one if she could make both shots on a 1-and-1. But she missed

the first one, denying herself a chance at the second. Carpenter got the rebound, but Cheylin prevented her from shooting until it was too late. Carpenter's effort missed, but the deficit was too great anyway.

Both coaches agreed that the game was won at the line.

"This is a real confidence-booster for us," Cougar coach Dennis Hengen said. "Our girls have never won before and they didn't believe in themselves. This should help."

"We just need to keep learning," Rush said. "We've gotten some great experience this season and we've got good talent. We just need to stay healthy next season and get our team gelled together. It seemed that this season, whenever we were about to really gel, someone would get hurt."

The 'Dawgs' season ends with a 5-13 record. Cheylin (4-14) meets 13-5 Herndon, the tournament's second seed, Thursday at 6 p.m. Central Time in Rexford.
