Sub-state begins Monday

The Goodland Cowboys will travel to Hays Monday to face Thomas More Prep in the opening round of the Class 4A sub-state basketball tournament, and Tuesday the Cowgirls will host the girls from Thomas More Prep of Hays at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The quarter-final, semi-final and championship games of the sub-state will be held at Max Jones Fieldhouse on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

In the first round Monday the games are played at the host school's site with the Colby Eagles the top seed in the boys bracket with a record of 13-5 will host Larned (3-16) at 6 p.m. Central Time.

Hugoton (12-7) will host Ulysses

(11-8) at 7 p.m. Central Time; Goodland (8-11) travels to Hays to face Thomas More Prep (13-6) at 7 p.m. Central Time; and Scott City (12-6) will host Pratt (8-10) at 7 p.m. Central Time.

In the first round games on the girls side Tuesday the Cowgirls are the top seed and they will host Thomas More Prep at 6 p.m. Mountain Time, Monday at Max Jones Fieldhouse. The Cowgirls have a 13-6 record to 0-19 for Thomas More Prep.

Larned (12-7) will host Scott City (10-8) at 7 p.m. Central Time; Pratt (13-6) will host Hugoton (0-19) at 7 p.m. Central Time; and Colby (12-6) will host Ulysses (5-14) at 7 p.m. Cen-

tral Time.

Thursday the winner of the first round boys games will play at Max Jones Fieldhouse with the first game beginning at 5 p.m. Mountain Time and the second game at 6:30 p.m. Mountain Time.

Friday the winners of the first round girls games will play at Max Jones Fieldhouse with the first game beginning at 5 p.m. Mountain Time and the second beginning at 6:30 p.m. Mountain Time.

Saturday the girls championship game will be held at 5 p.m. Mountain Time at Max Jones Fieldhouse with the boys championship game to follow at 6:30 p.m. Mountain Time.

Cowgirls lose to Oakley

The Goodland Cowgirls junior varsity basketball team lost to the Oakley Lady Plainsmen by a score of 28-21 at Saturday's game in Oakley.

In the first quarter, both teams made 6 points.

Then in the second quarter, Goodland scored 9 points to Oakley's 8, which gave them the lead with a score

of 15-14.

But in the third quarter, the Cowgirls fell behind.

The Lady Plainsmen made 8 points to Goodland's 3, to make the score 22-18.

In the final quarter, Oakley scored 6 points to Goodland's 3, and won the game.

Danielle Hellerud was the top scorer with 9 points after she hit three field

goals and three free throws.

Tranda Ihrig and Hayley Jarmin each made 4 points with two field goals a piece.

Britany Pettibone scored 2 points with one field goal.

Abby Scheopner and Tess Schultz both scored 1 point after they each made a free throw.

Kendra Billinger, Steph Fairbanks, and Jessica Vignery also played.

Coach reaches career milestone

LAWRENCE (AP) — Roy Williams, thanks in large part to Colorado, has reached a career milestone as Kansas coach.

Overcoming foul problems and near-perfect foul shooting by the Buffaloes, the 11th-ranked Jayhawks rang up a 91-79 victory Wednesday night. That gave Williams win No. 349, putting him No. 2 among Kansas coaches.

Twenty-nine of his wins have been at the expense of Colorado, which has only one victory against Kansas since Williams became coach in 1989.

"We have a lot of pride that we helped him accomplish that," said Jeff Carey, who came off the bench to score seven points and grab nine rebounds. "There's such a great relationship between coach and the players on this team. We feel great to be a part of his accomplishments."

Williams trails Phog Allen, a pioneer of college coaching, by 241 victories.

"Some day I will look back on it and feel really good," said Williams, whose career mark is 349-182. "I'll think about all the kids and how well they've represented us. On game night it doesn't seem all that important, because more than anything you want the

win.

"But yeah, it's pretty neat."

Nick Collison had a career-high 26 points and Kenny Gregory added 20 as Kansas (20-5, 9-4 Big 12) snapped a two-game losing streak and handed Colorado (15-12, 5-9) its third straight loss.

The Buffaloes hit their first 19 free throws and wound up 21-of-22 from the line.

"We gave it our all tonight, and that's the same focus we should come out with every night," said Colorado freshman Blair Wilson. "They have a huge (size) advantage with Chenowith and Collison out there. They kept pounding the ball inside and we couldn't match up, and there's not much we can do about that."

Eric Chenowith fouled out with 2:25 left, while Collison played the last few minutes with four fouls. Point guard Kirk Hinrich had three.

The Jayhawks, favored by 15 points, appeared to be pulling away early in the second half when Hinrich's 3-pointer and a pair of free throws by Chenowith put their lead at 52-36.

But the Buffaloes whittled away until Jamahl Mosely's bucket cli-

maxed a 7-1 run and made it 76-70 with 5:41 left.

Then Hinrich stole a pass and drove in for a layup, got fouled and made the free throw. A moment later Hinrich's two free throws put Kansas on top 83-72.

Chenowith had 17 points and nine rebounds for Kansas, which avoided its first three-game losing streak in seven years. Hinrich had 15 points and eight assists.

Mosley led Colorado with 20 points. D.J. Harrison, who had 26 points against Kansas in January, was 1-of-4 in the first half and finished with 15. He had the Buffaloes' only missed free throw. Stephane Pelle also had 15 points.

Gregory soared high for Carey's lob pass and slammed home a huge dunk that triggered a roar from the sellout crowd and capped an 11-3 run that gave the Jayhawks a 42-32 halftime lead.

Colorado, an 85-75 loser at home to the Jayhawks on Jan. 22, led by as many as three in the first half. Chenowith worked inside for a slam with five minutes left to put Kansas on top 27-25 and the Jayhawks never trailed again.
