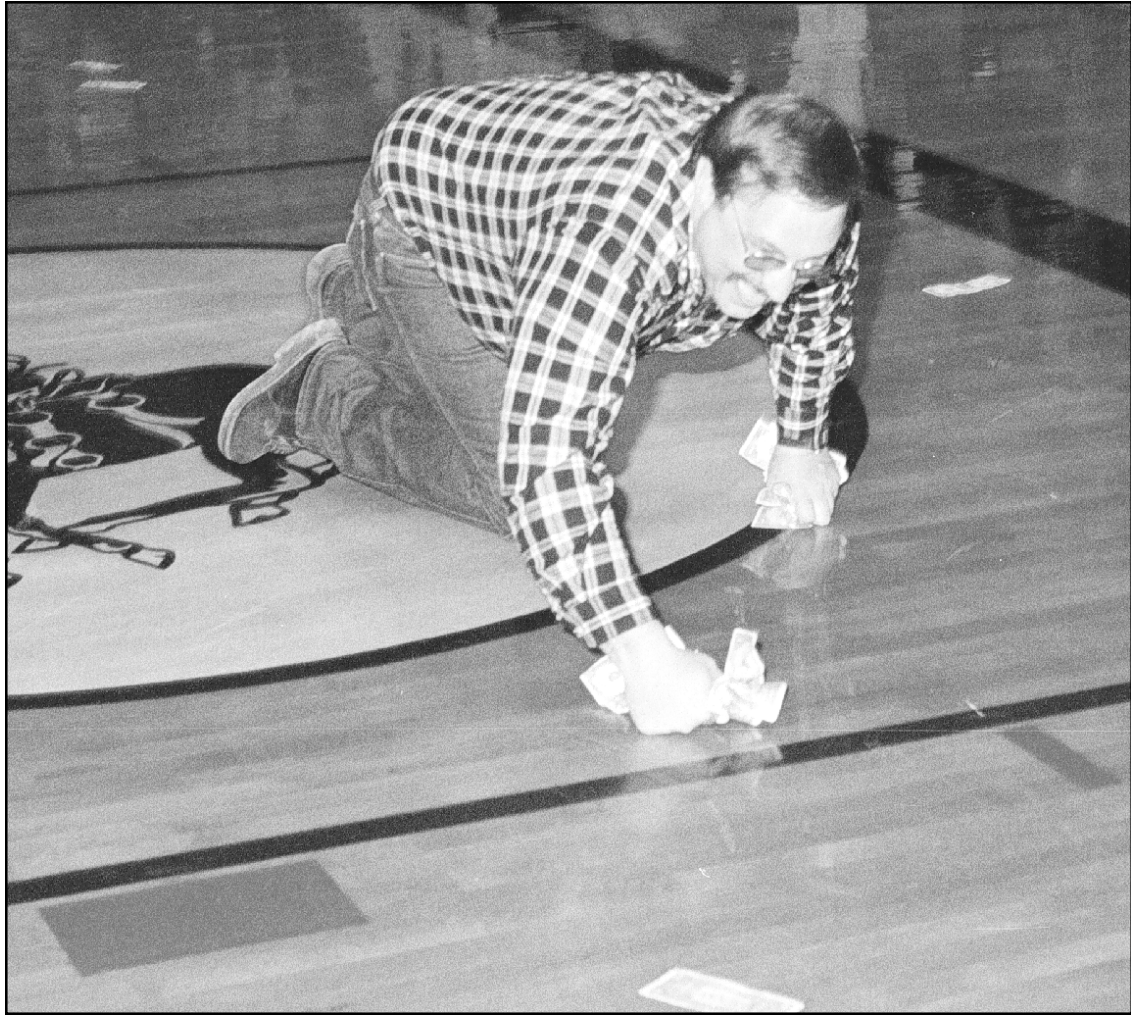


Money grab

Four advance at state

Four Cowboys advanced to the second round of the Class 4A state wrestling tournament in Wichita today.

The second round on the championship level was underway at press time and the four other Cowboys were awaiting the beginning of the consolation rounds at 6:30 p.m. Central Time to work their way into the medals. The semi-final championship round will be held at 6:30 p.m. Central Time on two mats while the consolations are being done on one mat.

Saturday morning the action begins at 9 a.m. Central Time with the consolation cross bracketing matches. The consolation quarterfinals are to begin at 11:30 a.m. Central Time and the consolation semifinals will begin at 1 p.m. Central Time.

Fifth place matches will begin at 2:30 p.m. and the consolation finals will get underway at 3:10 p.m.

The parade of champions will be at 6:10 p.m. with the championship matches beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Goodland's Blayne Bahe opened the action at 103 pounds with a 10-4 decision over Kyle Beebe of Parsons. In the second round Bahe will face Marcus Waters of Lansing. Waters is a sophomore with a 31-0 record compared to Bahe who is a freshman with a 25-4 record.

Bryce Abbey won his first round match with a fall in the third period

over Lucas Deal of Council Grove. Abbey will face Emery McReynolds of Columbus in the second round. Abbey extended his record to 25-2 and McReynolds' record is 36-1.

Bryce Bahe moved into the second round at 130 pounds with a 16-5 decision over Mark Williams of K.C. Sumner. He will face Greg Haslouer of Abilene in the second round. Bahe, a Goodland junior, extended his undefeated record to 31-0 and Haslouer's record, a senior at Abilene, is 18-6.

In the heavyweight division (275) Goodland's Curtis Swager won his first round match in overtime when he was awarded a penalty point against Josh Rebant of Atchison who was stalling. Earlier in the third period Swager had been leading 3-2, but Rebant was given a penalty point because the referee felt Swager was stalling. After

getting an early 3-1 lead Swager gave up two penalty points before winning in overtime. With the win Swager will move into the second round and will face Nathan Baker of Parsons.

In other first round action: Goodland's Kyle Schulte at 112 pounds lost by a fall in the second period to Eric Denault of Concordia. Schulte will face Luke Geske of Abilene in the first round of consolation.

At 119 pounds Goodland's Mark Carmichael lost an 18-9 decision to Eric Arveson of Chapman. Carmichael will face Andy Foster of K.C. Sumner in the first round of consolations.

Max Saint lost his first match at 145 pounds by a fall in the first period to Brandon Vanderbur of Osawatimie. Saint now will face Josiah Rush of clay Center in the first round of consolation.

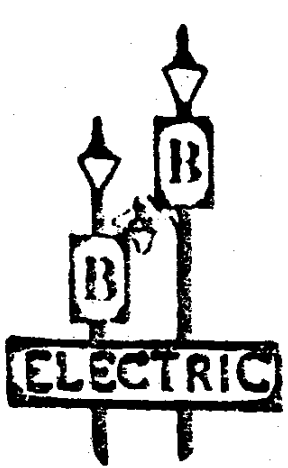
