# sports **Brewster qualifies for sub-state**

The Goodland Daily News REXFORD — Like a car with a leaky gas tank, Cheylin hung in the race for a half. Then the gas ran out.

Brewster won by 12, 68-56, in Friday's regional semifinals, automatically qualifying the Bulldogs (19-1) for sub-state play.

The loss ended Cheylin's season at 9-11.

The Bulldogs led by five, 20-15, at first quarter's end, but the Cougars came back to tie in the middle of the second quarter on a 7-0 run.

Cougar J.D. Hickert scored a layup, then Robbie Hankins hit for three. Cougar Kevin Partch found Nate Horinek hit consecutive buckets over Moyer for another score and the game was tied at 24.

Brewster's Brett Arnberger broke 28 Brewster. the tie with an 18-foot bucket, but Partch tied it up again from 10 feet out. Then the Cheylin tank sprung a leak.
