said students won't solicit advertisements from beer dealers or bars in Goodland, and will take steps to keep the signs from being damaged.

Students who brought a sample banner to the meeting said businesses can buy a sign for \$350, paying a \$100 renewal fee each year they want to continue advertising.

Liess said the students will pay \$150

for each banner — which come in eight colors — making a \$200 profit from the initial sale.

He said the money will go for college scholarships or new equipment for the high school.

"The students are looking to return the money to the school," he said, noting that businesses have said they will advertise.

Jane Philbrick said she liked the idea that the profits would go back to the

school and not for a ski trip.

Liess said after the meeting that the club has been looking for a big fundraising project but hasn't had much luck in the past.

# Israel Labor Party promotes peace

TELAVIV, Israel (AP)—Israel's center-left Labor Party has agreed to join a coalition headed by Prime Minister-elect Ariel Sharon, saying it wants to promote a peace agenda despite Sharon's opposition to more concessions to the Palestinians.

The decision was approved at a tumultuous party convention late Monday that reflected Labor's deep divisions, apparent since its defeat in a Feb. 6 election.

One-third of the delegates voted against joining Sharon's government, saying Labor would only

serve as a fig leaf for Sharon's hard-line policies.

With Labor's support, Sharon's chances of serving out his term until November 2003 were seen as having improved considerably. His other option would have been a narrow and probably unstable government of right-wing and religious parties with conflicting agendas.

Labor's elder statesman Shimon Peres, a leading proponent of a broad coalition and a candidate for foreign minister, said today that Sharon called him after the vote. "He expressed hope

that we can work together in the name of peace and security," Peres told Israel army radio.

Peres, an architect of the first peace accords with the Palestinians and a veteran of earlier unity governments, said he would "struggle in the name of peace."

Five months of the latest round of fighting have claimed 409 lives, including 337 Palestinians, 57 Israeli Jews and 15 others. Prominent Jewish settlers on Monday asked their government to expel or assassinate Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat.
