4-H clubs to begin model meetings Monday

As most 4-Hers are well aware, model meetings in Sherman County are quickly approaching. On Monday, Prairie Dale, Country Clovers and Beaver Valley 4-H clubs will hold their model meetings at the 4-H

Building. Ruleton Eager Beavers, Glendale Livewires, and Sunflower 4-H clubs will hold theirs on Monday, March 19, at the same place. The public is encouraged to attend.

While most people might enjoy model meetings, not many people understand their importance. Model meetings are meant to give 4-H members a better view of how to run a realworld meeting. Meetings are judged based upon Robert's Rules of Order, which are used in everyday life, such as for city and county commission meetings, school board meetings and many other political and social clubs. Members learn how to make and amend motions, table motions, and properly conduct a meeting. In addition, members learn important public speaking skills through demonstrations, project talks and health and safety talks. At the model meeting, judges will critique each club based on how well their meeting is conducted, how well the club has mastered its use of Robert's Rules of Order, and how well its members conduct themselves in the demonstrations and project talks presented. The model meeting encourages the participation of each 4-H member. They may last no longer than 35 minutes. The judges will also review the secretary's minutes and



the secretary's book.

Each year, judges select one club to move on to regional competition and see how they compare against other top clubs from the surrounding area.
