"When he finished it off with a home run, it means he was focused and concentrating all the way through the ballgame.'

Beltran said he has been throwing regularly and recently increased the distance of his throws to 150 feet.

"I'm not going to hurry myself because I want to be ready when the season starts," he said.

The Royals would like Beltran to play as he did in 1999, when he was voted AL Rookie of the Year after batting .294 with 22 homers and 108 RBIs.
