

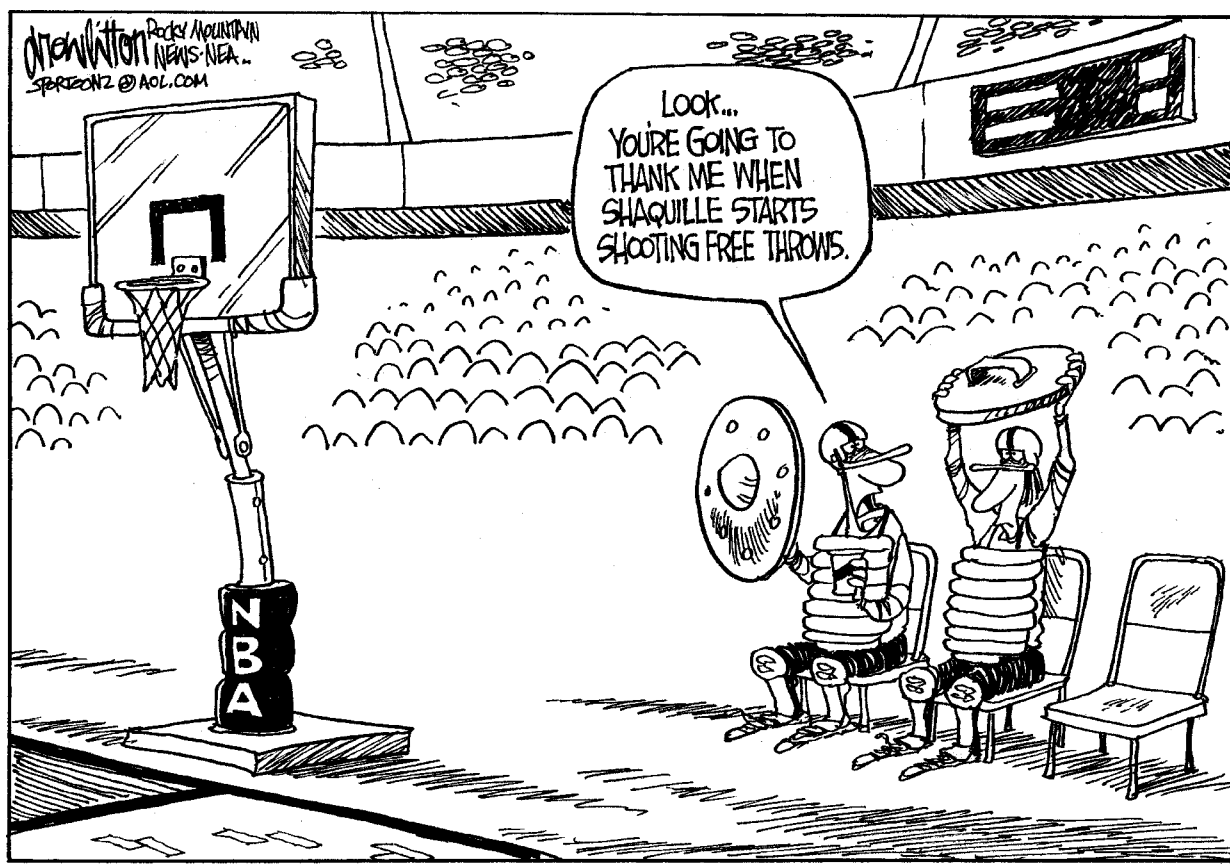

The Lady Mustangs lost their first game, against Colby, 37-20, but came back in the second game over Oberlin for third. Top scorer against Colby was Jordan Frazier, who had 8 points, 3 rebounds and 2 steals. Chelsea Gray had 5 points, 4 rebounds and 3 steals. Courtney Ragatz had 4 points, 4 rebounds and 2 steals. Melissa Swager had 2 points, 1 rebound and 1 blocked shot; and Justeen Kochler had 1 point, 4 rebounds and 5 steals. Briann Taylor had 4 rebounds; Lisha Tedford had 3 rebounds and 1 steal; Courtney Deines had 1 rebound and 2 steals; Megan Rubio had 1 rebound

and 2 steals; and Kali Rietcheck had 1 steal. May Davis and Tatum Schultz played but had no stats. High scorer in the game against Oberlin was Kochler, who had 10 points, 3 rebounds and 2 steals. Megan Rubio had 6 points, 3 rebounds and 3 steals. Schultz and Swager each had 5 points. Schultz had 3 rebounds and 2 steals, and Swager had 4 rebounds and 3 steals. Frazier had 2 points, 2 rebounds and 1 steal, and Ragatz had 1 point, 4 rebounds and 1 steal. Colby Eagles lose to Sumner in state quarterfinals, 59-49

SALINA — If Kansas City-Summer's Brandon Lipsey had fouled out of Wednesday's opening round, perhaps the state tournament game's outcome would have been different. Lipsey, the Sabres' post, played much of the second half with four fouls, but he managed to stay in the game and stay in the lane. That meant Colby had to shoot from outside. The Eagles' shots didn't fall and the Sabres prevailed 59-49. Summer didn't need to shoot inside. Nearly all their first-half scores came from 10 feet or farther. At first quarter's end, Sumner led by nine, 23-14, on Marques Nelson's shot from the free throw line. Lipsey came out for a while midway in the second quarter, opening up the lane. Eagle Justin Schwanke found Corey Woofier for a 15-footer and Eagle Zach Brown scored on a fast break layup. Sumner fouled Ross Barnett, then Parker McKee. Barnett

made both his free throws and McKee hit one. Colby was within two, 27-25, with 3:40 left in the half. Sumner's Jeff Hawkins answered with a shot from the baseline and a three to put the Sabres up by seven, 32-25, with 2:40 to go. Woofier and Sumner's Mike James exchanged buckets, then Woofier and McKee hit free throws to put Colby within five at the half, 34-29. Every time Colby made a run at Sumner, the Eagles rebounded well. Unfortunately, the Eagles turned over the ball about 10 times more often than Sumner, a fatal ratio that held up nearly all game. Eagle turnovers and Sabre quickness also kept the Eagles from using their favored running offense, forcing them into more of a half-court game. "We play a pretty decent half-court game," Colby coach Derek Bissitt said, "but we rely a lot on easy looks at the basket from our fast break. They did a good job of taking that away." After halftime, Sumner also did a

much better job of clogging the lane as Lipsey avoided fouls. He picked up his fourth, but the Sabres gambled and left him in. He stayed away from the final foul and the Eagles couldn't do much in the paint. Brown and McKee lit up Sumner for two treys in the third, but those two shots made up half of Colby's scoring in that quarter. Sumner out-scored Colby in the third 16-12. Sumner led by 11 on Ben Richardson's old-fashioned three-point play at 2:25 left in the third. Woofier put back McKee's trey tried for the third's final score, then opened fourth-quarter scoring with a bucket in the lane. Sumner's Reggie Bachus hit a layup from James, but Colby's Ross Barnett answered with a three. The Eagles were within six, 52-46, with 5:01 left. The teams traded buckets, then

Bachus and Hawkins hit field goals and Ben Richardson scored with a free throw to end the game with a 5-0 Sumner run. Colby shot 37.5 percent from the field, while Sumner shot 45.5 percent. "Our shots did not fall tonight, but that has a lot to do with playing a great team," Bissitt said. "We're not used to that kind of quickness." Woofier led the Eagles with 20 points and six rebounds. McKee scored 10 points with seven assists, three rebounds and a steal. Brown scored 10 points and had two boards. Barnett scored five points and garnered nine rebounds, three assists and two steals. Schwanke finished with four points, seven rebounds, an assist and a blocked shot. Brian Williams had two rebounds. Hawkins scored 19 for Sumner. Bachus and Lipsey had 10 points each.
