

Rockies lose exhibition, 6-5

Neagle allowed eight hits and five runs in four innings in the Colorado Rockies' 6-5 exhibition loss to the Anaheim Angels on Wednesday.

Neagle, who left the world champion New York Yankees to sign a freeagent contract with Colorado, gave up only two earned runs in nine innings in his first three spring appearances.
