Final Four coach's goal

LAWRENCE (AP) — Going to the ing to explain how they got ambushed Final Four twice in his first five years gave Roy Williams some very bad ideas.

"I thought, heck we'll be back here every couple of years," said the Kansas coach. "I really didn't enjoy it as much as I should have."

Williams' third Kansas team went all the way to the championship game in 1991 before losing to Duke. Then just two years later the Jayhawks were back in the Final Four in New Orleans.

Flush with success, he wasn't the only one who figured regular trips to college basketball's most coveted event had been ordained for him and his teams.

So did almost all the rabid Kansas fans, and more than a few of their envious opponents.

Then a harsh reality set in, something that will be a key part of their preparation for Friday night's Midwest Regional semifinal against Illinois in San Antonio.

Not only have the Jayhawks been shut out of the Final Four the past seven years, they've been embarrassed by early exits and undignified retreats. Three times since 1994 they were seeded No. 1 and once they were a No. 2. But every time they came home try-

by a lower seed.

Having All-Americans like Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz and winning more games than any other Division I program in the decade of the '90s did not seem to matter.

Hitting what for them seemed like rock bottom, Williams' Jayhawks, starting in 1998, got ousted in the second round three years in a row.

"I'm not saying it was good for me because I don't like pain and anguish and sorrow. And that's what that was," Williams said.

The result may be the same when Kansas meets Illinois — another disappointment and another Final Four dream denied.

Nevertheless, the Jayhawks will go into the game with a different attitude to get them to understand. You have no than the one that accompanied their previous setbacks.

"I've changed some. I don't think anybody stays the same over that period of time," Williams said. "I think I'm a better coach.

"Each and every year you become better as an X and O guy," he said. "You're exposed to it more, if you

work at it, and I do work at it. "And I do think I understand now how hard it is to get there."

While maintaining his intensity, Williams has also softened his approach.

'I was probably ... more demanding without being concerned about if it was fair, or anything like that. Now I think I'm demanding but also fair. There's a fine line between being demanding and being abrasive."

He can, in fact, be both.

"But I think the kids understand it as trying to reach some goals," he said.

If Williams has learned nothing else from all the disappointments of late, he knows to enjoy the ride.

"If you think college basketball is fun making the Sweet 16, you ought to make the Final Four," he has told his squad. "There's nothing like it.

'That's going to be something I try idea how much fun that is. I'm going to try to explain it."

And if they do win two more games in San Antonio and advance to the Final Four in Minneapolis, there'll be at least one member of the traveling party savoring every moment.

"I'd be as happy as anybody," Williams said with a grin. "I guarantee you, if we make it out of San Antonio, there won't be a sucker in the world happier than me."
