Fighting between Macedonia and Albania spills into Kosovo

SKOPJE, Macedonia — Fighting between the Macedonian army and ethnic Albanian insurgents spilled over into neighboring Kosovo, killing two people and adding to international pressure for negotiations to end the

Planning a trip today to Skopje, the Macedonian capital, Hans Haekkerup, the U.N. administrator of Kosovo, said he would be "raising the urgent need for restraint by the Macedonian forces and for dialogue to replace the shoot-

One of those killed in the shelling of Krivenik, a Kosovo village just 1,200 yards from the Macedonian border, was Associated Press Television News producer Kerem Lawton, a 30-yearold British national based in Pristina, the capital of the Serb province.

He died of shrapnel wounds he suffered when a mortar round hit his vehicle as he arrived in the village on Thursday morning. The United Nations said 20 were left wounded by the shelling.

Both the Macedonian army and the rebels denied responsibility for the mortar attack. Members of the NATOled peacekeeping force in Kosovo examined the craters left by the shells in an effort to determine who fired them.

JERUSALEM — Tension was high in Israel on today as its Arab citizens prepared for their annual Land Day protests, and Palestinians declared a general strike and a "Day of Rage' against Israeli measures.

In a departure from past limits, Defense Minister Binyamin Ben-Eliezer said Israeli soldiers would enter Palestinian-controlled areas if necessary. Asked about chasing militants into Palestinian territory, he said, "Everything ... is kosher."

In a telephone conference with U.S. Jewish leaders late Thursday, he said Israel would send forces to "any place we feel ... is endangering us."

Starting with an Israeli helicopter gunship assault on an elite Palestinian police unit Wednesday, Ben-Eliezer said he hoped "very (frequent) attacks that we are going to conduct" would persuade Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat that only negotiations can lead to a solution.

Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, ordering his first military operation since taking office March 7, charged that Arafat was responsible for promoting violence, and that his elite Force 17 guard was behind some of the attacks. **NATIONAL**

His life as a fugitive came to an end Thursday, when he was arrested outside a post office in Dinan, France.

FBI agent Joel Mercer said Kopp, one of the FBI's most wanted fugitives, was picking up a package from New York containing \$300 and may have planned to leave the country.

State and federal authorities will seek his extradition to the United States, where he faces charges in the October 1998 death of Dr. Barnett Slepian, 52. The Buffalo-area doctor was killed by a sniper's bullet as he heated soup in his kitchen.

Kopp, 46, known as "Atomic Dog" in anti-abortion circles, is also wanted by Canadian authorities for allegedly wounding an abortion doctor there in

Two people described as anti-abortion activists were arrested Thursday for allegedly plotting to hide Kopp in New York City.


